Infant

Infants learn to express themselves through art as well as talk about past historical figures as they paint with their teachers and talk about Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on the anniversary of his birth. The infants lean to develop fine motor control and experience new textures as they paint. They are also so learning to develop their vocabulary as their teachers talk with them and encourage them to make sounds and form words.



Toddler

Toddlers also learn to express themselves through the use of water color as they work on prints to brighten up their classroom. They also get to see chemical changes that occur when they add salt to the water color. They work on building their scientific how and why questioning as they participate in these activities



Preschool

We learn to work together in preschool to accomplish a common goal of building a volcano out of paper and glue. They are interested in chemical changes and what happens when things get mixed together. Children are scientist and are continuously asking why things happen. They also learn to develop new vocabulary as they talk with their teachers and peers.



K-Prep

We learn about the greater world around us as January comes to a close and people around the world celebrate Chinese New Year. We read literature on the subject and talk about how people celebrate these traditions. We even attempt to decorate in the ways that they do, and talk about how these traditions began.
