- 3) Why am I here? (Purpose)



3 Key Questions Adolescents are Asking

 - Am I a child of God?
- 2) Where do I fit in? (Belonging) Do I fit in to this parish family?
- 3) Why am I here? (Purpose)
 - What is my God-given purpose in life?

MISSIO DEI

Missio Dei is a Latin Christian theological term that can be translated as the "mission of God."

It's our WHY

To unite all of creation to God's self



Tools, but not reasons

Prayer, Bible Study, worship, etc. are to help us understand the Kingdom and calling of God. Without purpose, these become religious ritual that provide little meaning to teens.

Three Stages of Discipleship

Pre-Evangelized


- Not yet experienced a personal encounter with Jesus
- May not have developed a personal prayer life
- · Needs lots of relationship building , welcoming, encouragement
- May need healing
- Often doesn't attend Mass or participate in the sacramental life of the church


Evangelized

- On the road to discipleship
- Open to a relationship with Jesus
- · Beginning to develop a prayer life but may need mentoring
- · Beginning to understand how we meet Jesus personally in the sacraments

Disciples

- Are following Jesus and have given a Holy Spirit 'yes' to a life with His Church
- · May need ways to further expand their personal prayer life
- May want to explore scripture in deeper ways
- Good candidates for leadership roles within the parish community
- Would make great mentors to pre-evangelized people
- Would make great small group leaders, catechists, evangelizers






- 1. God creates

Myths about Confirmation

- 1. You're now an adult in the eyes of the Church.
- 2. This is your chance to say yes and to choose this Catholic faith.
- 3. You receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.
- 4. You need _____hours of community service to be Confirmed.
- 5. There's a body of knowledge of the doctrine that you must know to be confirmed.
- 6. Faith Formation ends at Confirmation.



OUTPOURING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

- The Holy Spirit is Christ's spirit in the Church and in every baptized person. This Holy Spirit living within us that is here to help us in every part of our lives. It never leaves us!
- THIS is what we are celebrating at Confirmation!
- It's this outpouring of the Holy Spirit that is being more fully understood by the candidates. Preparation should involve helping them to become more fully aware of this abundant gift that was given to them at baptism.







Sacramental Prep Objectives

These are the topics that a third grader should be familiar with before he/she is confirmed:

- 1. Know what is a sacrament.
- 2. Have an awareness of Baptism and our true identity in Jesus Christ.
- 3. Know that we receive the Holy Spirit in Baptism and are strengthened through Confirmation.
- 4. Know the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit.
- 5. Know that we need to be faithful to God's commandments.
- 6. Should have a sense of prayer and a need for God.
- 7. Should desire to build a relationship with Jesus Christ.
- 8. Should have experience with lectio divina.

His focus is for parishes to embrace a discipleship approach (evangelization) over a traditional classroom model.




