Glad You Asked: Why do young children bite and how should I respond?

While it can be very shocking to learn that your child has bitten another child, or that your child has been bitten by another child, this behavior is very typical among infants and toddlers. There are a number of developmental explanations for why biting occurs, and a variety of strategies to address and prevent the behavior.
