The Trunk: Mission Centered—Family Focused

Although no one is immune to the strains placed on family life today, not everyone has the resources to deal effectively with family crisis. Thanks to your investment in our work, Families First has steadfastly maintained its commitment to serve troubled individuals and families regardless of their ability to pay. We go to great lengths



to remove barriers for those who need our help--offering free child care while parents meet with their counselors or attend classes; sending staff out into the community to work with families in their own homes; and offering a sliding fee scale that ensures high quality professional help is affordable even for those with very limited resources. Without your help, none of this would be possible!

We can't thank you enough for joining in our mission to create healthier communities by strengthening individuals and families through life's challenges and changes. Here is just a sample of what we achieved in 2014 with your support:

- 1,911 people received counseling which helped repair relationships, heal from trauma, cope with loss, or find new perspectives for their lives;
- 2,375 primary and secondary victims of domestic violence were empowered to break free from lives of fear and abuse;
- 57 vulnerable seniors and adults with disabilities received in-home support that ensured their health and safety and shielded them from abuse, neglect, and exploitation;
- 96% of the men and women who received chemical dependency treatment improved their employment status and their ability to financially provide for their families; and
- 100 Ivy Tech students received on-campus counseling to help them stay in college and earn their degree.


Healthy Communities & Strong Families

A strong family depends on the health of each member. When one family member is struggling with an unhealthy lifestyle, everyone in the family is affected. That's why your gifts to Families First are put to work to address the needs of the entire family, not just the individual.

Last year, as our addictions counselors worked to free more than 1,055 people from the prison of substance abuse, they also helped partners, siblings and children better understand and cope with their loved one's disease. Your generosity helped 289 parents participate in parenting education courses that gave them the tools and knowledge base needed to build a solid foundation for their families. And 444 struggling families in our community received in-home therapy to resolve risk factors and strengthen their ability to provide safe, nurturing care for their children.

Because you reached out to help our clients with your generous support, parents are better equipped to lead healthy and productive lives and children are more likely to meet developmental milestones and achieve academic success. Together, we are growing stronger as a community and creating a better future for all of us, one family at a time.
