Infant

Did you know one of our Signature Practices is "Prime Times" are those teachable moments of one-on-one responsive and nurturing interactions between an adult and a child--those moments when a child has your full attention. These are times when basic human needs are being met such as supporting an infant when he or she is learning to walk. Our teachers build trusting relationships with your child creating those moments... nurturing, communicating, and interacting often throughout the school day.

Toddlers

Meet our budding artists---Sebastian and Judah! These young toddlers are engaging in meaningful art activities expressing their creativity at the easel making deliberate markings and drawings using color and a paintbrush. What an exciting moment to see your creations come to life on paper as a special masterpiece!

Young Preschool

We can do it...yes we can! Everett, Blaise, and Ayla are practicing good personal health care as they work on brushing their teeth at school. These young preschoolers are learning about proper hygiene when following simple instructions such as making sure to brush the top and bottom rows of teeth moving their brushes from front to back. Tooth brushing is an important part of our health and safety program understanding the importance of cleanliness.

Preschool

Water Play provides opportunities for children to develop fine and gross motor skills. Children increase their fine motor skills and hand to eye coordination practicing pouring, squirting, scrubbing, scooping, stirring and squeezing. Water play also releases energy which can be invigorating or relaxing for young children running their hands through the water. As well water play increases a child's ability to focus on one activity when presented as a tranquil and repetitive activity. Gentle water play allows children to unwind, calm down and order their thoughts. Great job Lea!

Kindergarten Prep/Kindergarten

"In the month of August the kindergarten classroom participated in several field trips. One of the most amazing presentations was "Ben the Bubble Man!" The bubble man was able to create bubbles of all different sizes that when floating could be captured without bursting. The most unique bubble was the "square" bubble! Cooking - A Family Affair

Gathering in kitchens nourishes our bodies, minds, and souls. Preparing meals together as a family enhances relationships, invites contribution, and helps children understand basic cooking principles. Also, children develop patience as they discover that delicious food doesn't just magically appear. Although cooking as a family affair is probably not as easy as adults whipping up a quick dinner, with a bit of forethought, more cooks stirring a pot can be fun and has tremendous benefits for everyone involved.

Cooking with children helps them learn about nutrition and hone basic reading, math, and science concepts. Reading recipes and learning kitchen vocabulary expands literacy skills, while counting, measuring, and fractions, foster mathematical thinking. Young chefs learn about chemistry and the physical properties of matter as they mix ingredients and watch them combine, separate, expand, change color, develop scents, and change form.

Research shows that children who help in the kitchen develop healthy eating habits because they tend to eat what they prepare. Below are a few suggestions for toddlers and preschoolers.

Toddlers

Choose simple cooking tasks that match your toddler's skills and attention span.

- Wash fruit and vegetables.
- Measure, pour, mix, and stir ingredients.
- Put ingredients in a crockpot or blender.
- Mash potatoes.



Preschoolers

Discuss nutrition and why our bodies and minds need the right kind of fuel to work correctly.

- Help plan meals.
- Chop, grate, peel, and cut ingredients.
- Shuck corn.
- Crack eggs.
- Count and categorize ingredients (wet and dry items).
