



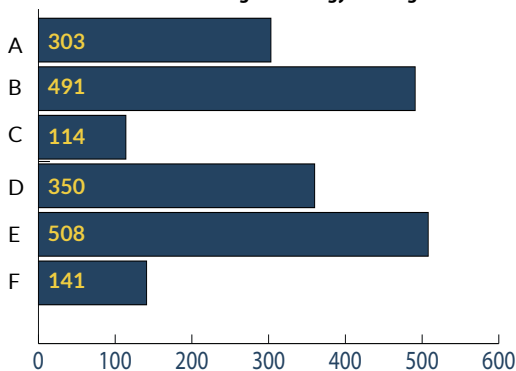

### BUDGET PRIORITIES

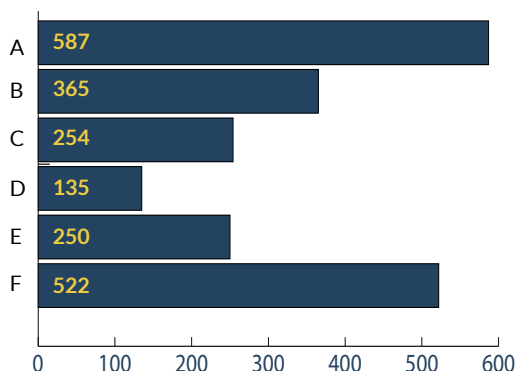

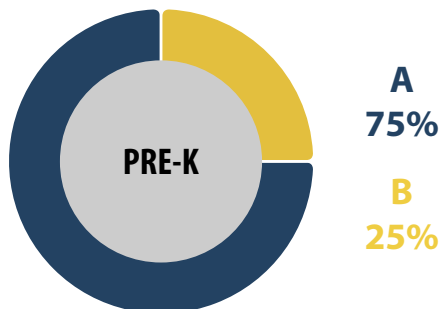
2. Which of the following changes would you support to increase road funding? (You may select more than one option.)

### ROAD FUNDING

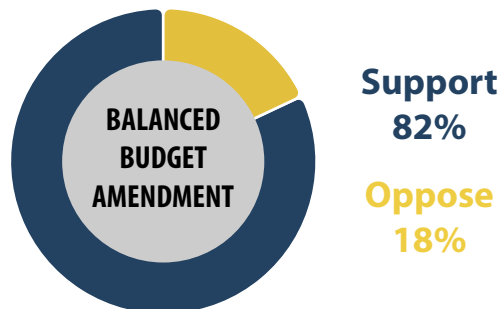
- A. Increasing the gas tax

- F. None of the above



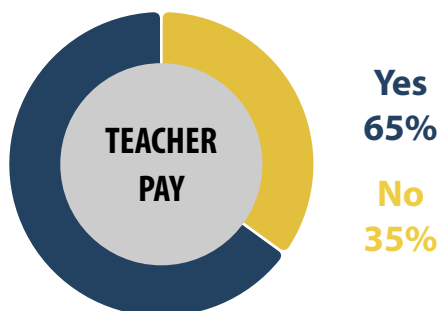

5. The U.S. is facing a shortage of teachers in subjects like math, science and special education. Do you think Indiana should direct more school funding specifically to teacher pay?



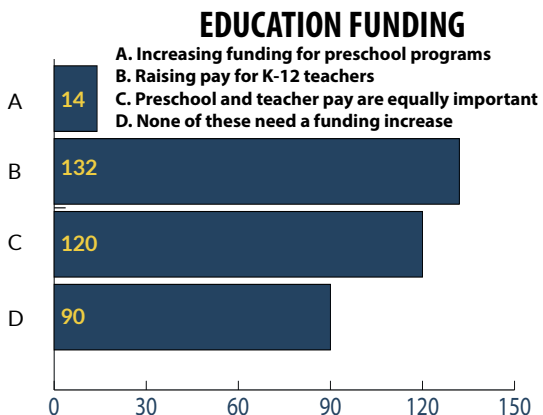

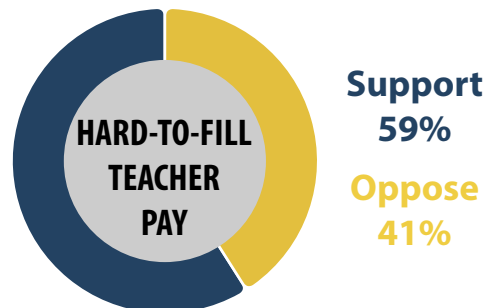
