# PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

## ULLURIAT

Ulluriat is Sirivik's youth country food program working to increase youth involvement in the traditional food system. On the land outings and workshops with knowledge holders provide youth the opportunity to gain new skills, confidence and increased access to country food.

Ulluriat is coordinated by two Inukjuamiut youth who previously participated in the program as a youth and a guide.

In 2020 the project hired 10 local hunters as guides and had 20 youth participate in outings including seal hunting, caribou hunting and ice fishing.





## CHALLENGES & OPPORTUNITIES IN A PANDEMIC

The shutdown in March of 2020 put increased strain on the food system in Inukjuak. However, quick thinking, hard work and collaboration lead to a surge in food support for Inukjuamiut.

The Inukjuak food security task force was created to facilitate communication between organizations contributing to food security in Inukjuak. Together these organizations launched two key programs to ensure continued food support.

The meal delivery program delivered hot meals four days a week to Inukjuamiut with emphasis on elders and those in need of urgent food support. While the food box initiative delivered emergency food boxes to households in need once a week.


