The middle finger snaps against the thumb, as if calling a dog. You can also pat your front thigh several times.




INSECT

The "3" hand is held with the thumb touching the nose. The two fingers wiggle together.



BUTTERFLY

With palms facing down, the thumbs lock together and the hands flap up and down, like butterfly wings.



WORM

The palm of the flat base hand faces to the side. The index finger of the action hand is placed in the palm. The index finger curls and straightens as it moves across the palm like a worm crawling.
