The Apostles' Creed is the most ancient statement of the Christian faith still in regular use in the church today. Children are taught to memorize it, anyone who prays the Rosary says it at the beginning of each set of mysteries, and it remains one of the basic prayers in the Catholic canon. Yet where did it come from, what does it actually mean, and why are we called to believe it? Dr. Brian Schmisek will be with us to engage what the church calls the twelve "articles" of the Apostles' Creed and to explore their meaning for a twenty-first century faith. We'll examine the scriptural roots of each article and punctuate that with questions designed to elicit and share faith. Our time together will connect scripture and the Creed to lived faith today.



Dr. Brian Schmisek is Provost and Dean of Faculties at Saint Mary's University of Minnesota. He has also served at Loyola University Chicago and was the founding dean of the School of Ministry at the University of Dallas. He earned his Ph.D. in Biblical Studies from The Catholic University of America and is the author of many books and resources grounded in scripture, including the most recent editions of the Catholic Biblical School student workbooks and teacher guides.
