GDOE Response: Using data as of November 30, 2022, the Guam Department of Education employed approximately 1,953 total teachers for School Year 2022-2023. 97 positions designated as overall Teacher Shortages, out of which 51 positions are filled by teachers who are certified by irregular, temporary, emergency certificate or degree holders and 33 vacant positions, still pending to fill. See Figure 1 above.

2. An assurance that the Chief State School Official (CSSO) consulted with private nonprofit elementary and secondary school officials within the state.

GDOE Response: Through the efforts of the US DOE Consolidated Grant, State Fiscal Stabilization Fund (SFSF), and other programmatic grants, The Guam Department of Education maintains a collaborative relationship with private elementary and secondary schools within Guam.
