

MUSIC DIRECTOR GUSTAVO DUDAMEL SHAPES THE LOS ANGELES PHILHARMONIC 2012/13 SEASON WITH A SERIES OF SIGNATURE PROGRAMS FRAMING THE YEAR

Season Highlights include:

<u>Mozart/Da Ponte Trilogy</u> - Dudamel and the LA Phil continue this innovative project with The *Marriage of Figaro*, using a Paris-based design team of architect Jean Nouvel (installation) and costumes by couturier Azzedine Alaïa.

<u>*The Gospel According to the Other Mary*</u> – Dudamel conducts the **fully staged** production of LA Phil Creative Chair John Adams' new oratorio, directed by Peter Sellars.

<u>Where the Wild Things Are</u> – Dudamel leads Oliver Knussen's one-act opera based on Maurice Sendak's classic children's book in a new production that uses innovative technologies to combine live images of the performers with Sendak's artwork. (Co-production with the Barbican, London and the Aldeburgh Festival.)

Beethoven with Andsnes – Dudamel and Norwegian pianist Leif Ove Andsnes launch a three-year exploration of Beethoven's music for piano and orchestra.

Esa-Pekka Salonen – Conductor Laureate Salonen celebrates the 100^{th} anniversary of the birth of Lutosławski with the LA Phil and brings the Philharmonia Orchestra from London for a concert performance of Alban Berg's opera *Wozzeck*.

Zubin Mehta returns to the Los Angeles Philharmonic to celebrate the 50th anniversary of his becoming the orchestra's Music Director; later in the season he brings the Israel Philharmonic with soloist Yuja Wang.

Brooklyn Festival – A celebration of the contributions of Brooklyn artists to American music, from Aaron Copland to Samuel Adams, with newly commissioned scores from Ted Hearne and Matt Marks, as well as a major work by Tyondai Braxton.

Focus on Peter Eötvös – A residency of Hungarian composer Peter Eötvös, including the world premiere of his Concerto for Violin and Chamber Orchestra co-commissioned by the LA Phil, the Leipzig Gewandhaus and the BBC, performed by Midori, and the West Coast premiere of his opera *Angels in America*.

Bach Keyboard Cycle – András Schiff launches a survey of the complete solo keyboard works of J.S. Bach in six recitals over two seasons.

<u>Wayne Shorter & Esperanza Spalding</u> – The world premiere of a co-commissioned piece by jazz legend Wayne Shorter composed for Grammy-winning bassist Esperanza Spalding with the Los Angeles Philharmonic.

<u>Commissions & Premieres</u> - 9 new commissions, 7 world premieres, 3 U.S. premieres and 4 West Coast premieres

Tour - Three programs including John Adams' *The Gospel According to the Other Mary* will be presented in London, Paris, New York and Lucerne in March 2013.

Los Angeles (February 6, 2012) – Music Director Gustavo Dudamel and President Deborah Borda announced today the 2012/13 season of the Los Angeles Philharmonic. Gustavo Dudamel's vision for innovative, adventurous programming unfolds in a series of signature programs and artistic partnerships that define and shape the fourth year of his Music Directorship. These major projects further the LA Phil's dedication to contemporary composers and reinforce cutting edge collaborations that reinterpret the classics; all of these are the pillars of Dudamel's next season.

Alongside 9 new commissions, 7 world premieres, 3 U.S. premieres and 4 West Coast premieres, the season highlights include three major theatrical, multi-media productions:

- the second installment of the three-year Mozart opera project with *The Marriage of Figaro*;
- international tour of Creative Chair John Adams' oratorio *The Gospel According to the Other Mary*, directed by Peter Sellars;
- Oliver Knussen's one-act opera Where the Wild Things Are.

Additionally two important multi-year projects will be launched, each featuring major artists concentrating on the work of a single composer:

- Beethoven with Leif Ove Andsnes
- Bach Keyboard Cycle with András Schiff

The championing of new music and the nurturing of young composers across all genres will be represented by the Brooklyn Festival, a bi-coastal collaboration with the Brooklyn Philharmonic focusing on the contributions of Brooklyn artists to American music.

"Under Gustavo Dudamel's leadership, the LA Phil presents one of the most forward looking and diverse symphonic seasons in the world today, embodying the core values of our institution: innovation and excellence," said Deborah Borda, President and Chief Executive Officer. "We continue our commitment to the music of our time while presenting the world's most important artists and celebrating our rich musical heritage. Gustavo's vibrant spirit and sense of community is reflected by the rich educational initiatives of the organization. Leading the way through mentorship, collaboration and community outreach, Youth Orchestra LA (YOLA) continues the El Sistema-inspired movement, setting a national example which reflects the evolution of Gustavo's vision as our Music Director."

"Being in Los Angeles and working with the musicians and people of the LA Phil is a total joy!" said Gustavo Dudamel. "My relationship with the musicians has really evolved, we have become so very close that entering Walt Disney Concert Hall feels like being home. This season we take the opportunity to cultivate and advance this connection with our music making together, not just for ourselves but with our audiences too, sharing this journey together and having fun!"

GUSTAVO DUDAMEL 2012/13 PERFORMANCES

Walt and Lilly Disney Chair Music Director Gustavo Dudamel conducts the Los Angeles Philharmonic in 10 weeks of subscription concerts that exemplify the vision he brings to his Music Directorship. The 2012/13 season includes 9 LA Phil commissions, 7 world premieres, 3 U.S. premieres and 4 West Coast premieres, with Dudamel at the helm of numerous large-scale projects. He leads the second installment of the Mozart/Da Ponte Trilogy with a fully staged production of *The Marriage of Figaro*; premieres the staged version of John Adams' oratorio *The Gospel According to the Other Mary*; and conducts a multimedia presentation of Oliver Knussen's one-act opera *Where the Wild Things Are*, based on Maurice Sendak's classic children's book.

THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO THE OTHER MARY

John Adams' *The Gospel According to the Other Mary* is an oratorio for orchestra, chorus and soloists. Based on the New Testament stories of Lazarus and Jesus' Passion, plus contemporary Latin American poetry, the work takes a fresh approach to the combination of materials that Adams pioneered so successfully in *El Niño*. The libretto, created by Peter Sellars, draws from the works of the Mexican poet Rosario Castellanos, Dorothy Day, Louise Erdich, and June Jordan. Three countertenors serve as narrator for the story. The work will be world premiered May 31, June 1-3, 2012 and the staged version will be presented in March 2013, directed by Peter Sellars. The project will be taken on an international tour immediately following the L.A. performances (see page 15).

ZUBIN MEHTA

Zubin Mehta returns to conduct the Los Angeles Philharmonic in celebration of the 50th anniversary of his Music Directorship with the orchestra, with a repeat of his first concert as Music Director. Mehta's tenure with the LA Phil began in 1962, when he was just 26 years old, making him the youngest Music Director hired by the orchestra, and ended in 1978. The Israel Philharmonic Orchestra (IPO) appointed Mehta its Music Director in 1969, and the appointment was extended for life in 1981. He remains a frequent guest conductor of the Los Angeles Philharmonic and will also be joined by the IPO and pianist Yuja Wang as part of the LA Phil's Visiting Orchestras series this season.

BROOKLYN FESTIVAL

Location has always figured prominently in the world of art and music. For today's most forwardthinking music-lovers, Brooklyn has emerged as ground zero for young compositional talent. From composers whose work has begun to inform the repertoire of contemporary orchestras and ensembles, such as Ted Hearne, to those pushing the boundaries of art rock and electronic music, such as Tyondai Braxton, Brooklyn has become the incubator of innovative music ideas. In the 2012/13 season, the LA Phil, in a bi-coastal collaboration with the Brooklyn Philharmonic, focuses on the contribution of Brooklyn artists to American music – from Aaron Copland to today's up-and-coming voices. In April of 2013, the LA Phil performs works by Brooklyn composers in orchestral, ensemble and other settings. Alan Pierson, Music Director of the Brooklyn Philharmonic and conductor of the festival Green Umbrella program, comments, "I've been a huge admirer of the LA Phil for years, so it's very exciting to get to work with them on bringing some of the amazing music and culture that's being created in Brooklyn to a West Coast audience."

Following his successful two-year project in which he performed all 32 of Beethoven's piano sonatas in seasons 2007/08 and 2008/09, András Schiff begins his two-year exploration of Bach's complete keyboard music with two Colburn Celebrity Recitals and one Baroque Variations performance this season. He starts in October with Book One of *The Well-Tempered Clavier*, followed by Book 2, and in April, delves further into Bach's keyboard repertoire as he presents the complete Keyboard Partitas in a single evening.

<u>TOUR</u>

In March, Gustavo Dudamel and the Los Angeles Philharmonic embark on their second European tour together commencing with the orchestra's long-awaited first International Associate Residency with the Barbican in London and continuing with performances in Lucerne and Paris. During the Barbican residency, Dudamel and the LA Phil will perform the European premiere of John Adams' new oratorio *The Gospel According to the Other Mary*, directed by Peter Sellars (co-commissioned by the LA Phil; Barbican; Lincoln Center; Lucerne Festival; Cité de la Musique, La Villette; and Zaterdagmatinee). Additional works to be performed include Vivier's *Zipangu*, Debussy's *La mer*, and Stravinsky's *Firebird*. Also during the Barbican residency, Dudamel and the LA Phil New Music Group perform the European premiere of a new work by Unsuk Chin (co-commissioned by the LA Phil and the Barbican). The Green Umbrella program will also feature John Adams' Chamber Symphony conducted by the composer. Dudamel and the LA Phil then return to the U.S. for two performances at Avery Fisher Hall in New York, including the East Coast premiere of *The Gospel According to the Other Mary*.

GREEN UMBRELLA

The groundbreaking Green Umbrella new music series, overseen by LA Phil Creative Chair John Adams, is at the heart of the LA Phil's mission to maintain the life and health of contemporary music. Currently in its third decade, the series offers five concerts during the 2012/13 season, with three composer-focused programs performed by the Los Angeles Philharmonic New Music Group including an LA Phil-commissioned world premiere, conducted by Gustavo Dudamel.

The series kicks off with Creative Chair **John Adams** conducting works by American **Nico Muhly** – *Seeing Is Believing* (West Coast premiere) – and the Icelandic **Daníel Bjarnason** – *Bow to String* (U.S. premiere) and the world premiere of a new LA Phil commissioned work. The two contemporaries' work will be complemented by Muhly's arrangements of William Byrd, whose music has been a great inspiration to the young composer.

EDUCATION

LA Phil's Innovative Work with Youth Orchestras

Youth Orchestra LA (YOLA)

Youth Orchestra LA (YOLA) is the Los Angeles Philharmonic's initiative to provide access to free, high quality instrumental and orchestral education in order to promote youth development. Central to YOLA is the LA Phil's plan to build, with community partners, youth orchestras in underserved communities throughout Los Angeles. YOLA families are engaged in making music themselves while supporting their children's development, with the vision that YOLA neighborhoods become vibrant centers of musical culture with a deepened sense of community. YOLA is inspired by El Sistema, the Venezuelan music education system that nurtured the Los Angeles Philharmonic's Music Director, Gustavo Dudamel.

YOLA at EXPO: YOLA's First Site

The YOLA program at EXPO Center, part of Exposition Park in South L.A., has grown to include three orchestras, a preschool program, mentorship, group lessons, chamber music and parent ensembles. The program serves hundreds of students who attend four days each week. In addition, students perform annually at Walt Disney Concert Hall and have appeared multiple times on the iconic stage of the Hollywood Bowl. Now in its 5th year, YOLA at EXPO serves over 400 students ages 2-17.

YOLA at EXPO is a partnership of the LA Phil, The Harmony Project, and the EXPO Center, a City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks facility.

YOLA at HOLA (Heart of Los Angeles): YOLA's Second Site

Located in the Rampart District, YOLA at HOLA (Heart of Los Angeles) serves hundreds of students with intensive after-school orchestral instruction five days a week. Classes include music creativity, singing and solfège, ensemble rehearsals, and an hour of academic tutoring daily. This holistic approach fosters a sense of community and provides the students with the opportunity to take advantage of HOLA's exceptional programs and resources. Now in its 3nd year, YOLA at HOLA serves over 200 students, ages 6-13.

YOLA at HOLA is a partnership between the LA Phil and Heart of Los Angeles (HOLA).

YOLA Neighborhood Project (YNP)

The YOLA Neighborhood Project (YNP) aims to build healthy communities through universal access to music. In South L.A. and the Rampart District, school-day residencies inspire local students to join YOLA; local parent ensembles provide families with the opportunity to learn music; and LA Phil neighborhood concerts allow the community at large to experience one of the world's greatest orchestras in their own backyard. Each year, YNP culminates in a joint performance of over 1,000 children from partner schools and YOLA – demonstrating the immense power and joy of musical collaboration.

YOLA Stakeholder Network

The aspiration that every child should have access to the experience of playing in an orchestra is shared by a community of music education providers in Southern California. The LA Phil brings these diverse organizations together as the YOLA Stakeholder Network to think big in service of children, recognizing that we can accomplish more together than on our own. Convened four times each year, the Network consists of over 50 public and private music education and social service organizations invested in YOLA's mission spanning from Santa Barbara to San Diego.

The goals of the YOLA Stakeholder Network include:

- Developing new orchestras of underserved youth
- Pooling resources to improve existing programs or develop new programs in targeted communities

- Creating a pipeline for underserved youth to develop the skills to perform in established youth and in-school orchestras
- Support professional development initiatives for arts specialists and teaching artists

Youth Orchestra Mentorship Program

The Youth Orchestra Mentorship Program connects school and independent youth orchestras with the Los Angeles Philharmonic in a deep-rooted tradition of mentorship. Youth orchestra directors work closely with Los Angeles Philharmonic teaching faculty and education staff to identify program goals, cultivate a professional community, and actively contribute ideas and resources to the YOLA Stakeholders Network and the El Sistema movement. Students work closely with the LA Phil teaching artist faculty to raise their self-expectations, improve individual and ensemble musicianship, and recognize and access resources that will continue to serve them beyond the rehearsal space and time. The 16 orchestras that participate in this 2-year program have access to coaching sessions, masterclasses, and concert tickets. Four of these orchestras successfully auditioned to be *Premier* partners, affording them the opportunity to perform at Walt Disney Concert Hall and to work with one of the talented high school-aged composers from the LA Phil's Composer Fellowship Program.

NEW: Take a Stand

Just as YOLA has captured the imagination of so many, the inspiration of El Sistema has spread across the United States. To support this burgeoning movement, the LA Phil has formed an innovative partnership with two renowned institutions: Longy School of Music and Bard College. This bi-coastal alliance launched Take a Stand, a national initiative that supports social change through music. Take a Stand's key project areas are: Annual Conferences for field-wide learning and the Master of Arts in Teaching in Music degree program, situated in L.A. on the campus of YOLA at HOLA.

Take a Stand is a partnership of the LA Phil, Bard College and the Longy School of Music.

TOYOTA SYMPHONIES FOR YOUTH

The ultimate family event, combining fun and fantasy, the TSFY concert series at Walt Disney Concert Hall introduces the world of classical music to children through imaginative and original story-telling that features the orchestra in a theatrical setting. This series of captivating orchestral concerts for children (ages 5-11) is led by the LA Phil's Dudamel Conducting Fellows and directed by theater artists. Before every concert, from 10 am to 11 am, Walt Disney Concert Hall becomes a musical playground with hands-on art making, musical activities, dance, and storytelling or theater. Workshops take place in the lobby spaces one hour prior to the performance.
