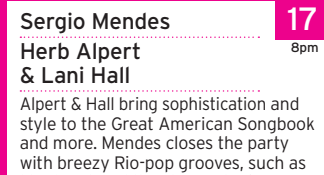

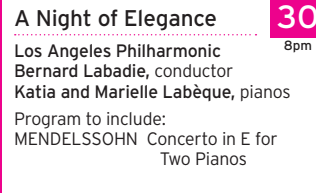

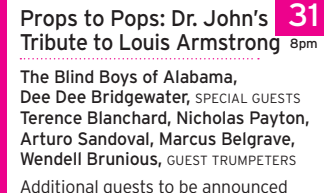
**Pink Martini**
