
Blue Room

Like all of our classrooms, the Blue Room celebrated Lunar New Year. They explored red envelopes, coins, and watched a short video of Chinese Lion Dances. The teachers encouraged children to count coins and asked them to guesstimate how many coins would fit into a red envelope. Through this activity, the children were introduced to traditions celebrated in the Asian and Pacific Islander cultures; they developed their mathematical concepts and strengthened their sensory and fine motor skills.

The story is about a teacher who encourages her students to explore ways to be kind by drawing pictures and making a class quilt together. 
Black History Books for Kids
