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

Dear Friends,

This was a record-breaking year. We had historic numbers:

Our largest membership—**6,415**

Our highest yearly attendance-161,878

Our greatest numbers for a three-month exhibition-**59,403**

We also had more students visit our Museum than ever before—**17,453**—a 56% increase over last year.

Growth like this shows the Museum is proving its relevance to people's lives.

With eleven special exhibitions, we carried our visitors to cultures and times both distant and near—from *Lethal Beauty: Samurai Weapons and Armor* to *Thomas Sully: Painted Performance* and from *Bob Kuhn: Drawing on Instinct* to *Matisse: Life in Color.*

Each exhibition was different, but every exhibition was designed to reach new and diverse audiences. *Matisse* not only filled the Museum with delighted visitors but also captivated and inspired our city as we partnered with more than twenty organizations through our "Matisse Paints the Town" promotion. With this exhibition, we proved San Antonio a visual arts destination that rivals Dallas and Houston.

The donation of artworks (an astonishing 353 pieces) from the Brown family was another great highlight of the year. These precious examples of Asian ceramics and other art forms fill our Asian galleries and make our museum an important resource for scholars. Our visitors are inspired by the beauty, power, and delicacy of the traditions of Chinese ceramics, as well as Korean, Vietnamese, and Thai—right here in San Antonio!

The past year brought its sorrows as well. Our community lost Walter F. Brown in July. With his passion for Asian art, this remarkable man dedicated himself to making the Museum world class and he worked tirelessly to ensure that we would thrive in the long term. We surely miss him.

We have taken bold steps forward, and with growth also come challenges. More visitors mean more staff, more supplies, more air conditioning, more building and collections maintenance, more printing, and more expectations. Revenue from visitors only accounts for a small portion of our costs. We exceeded our goals for membership, yet as we have grown, we receive less money from the City of San Antonio. We are fortunate to have a dedicated board and individual patrons who sustain us. We continue to plan for growth and to expand our relevance to all of you and the community we serve.

Thank all of you for your support of the Museum and our vision for the future!

Danny Lyon: The Bikeriders September 7, 2013–December 1, 2013 Small Special Exhibitions Gallery, 3rd Floor Curator: David Rubin

In 1968, Danny Lyon published The Bikeriders, featuring an iconic series of photographs taken from 1963-67. Lyon photographed his subjects from the inside, rather than simply being an observer. In 1963 he joined the Chicago Outlaws Motorcycle Club, becoming friends with his subjects and helping to demystify a culture that was often stereotyped as a form of "low life." *Danny* Lyon: The Bikeriders featured fifty photographs, all recent gifts to the Museum from Ernest Pomerantz and Marie Brenner.



Eldzier Cortor is one of the only living African-American artists who worked during the Works Progress Administration. He attended art school in Chicago and travelled to Jamaica, Cuba, and Haiti on Guggenheim Fellowships. Eldzier Cortor: Master Printmaker featured an impressive compilation of artist's proofs and early impressions, including complete runs of the "Jewels," "Facets," and "L'Abbatoire" series. The artist gave the Museum an artist's proof or early impression of nearly every print made in his lifetime.

Diego Rivera in San Antonio

December 15, 2013–December 1, 2014 Latin American Modern, Contemporary Gallery, 2nd Floor Curator: Marion Oettinger Jr.

Diego Rivera's El Albañil (The Bricklayer, 1903), painted when the artist was 18, was on view in the Museum's Nelson A. Rockefeller Center for Latin American Art, along with eight other works that spanned much of the artist's career. This small focus installation provided a glimpse of the brilliance of one of Mexico's greatest artists. El Albañil, on permanent loan to the Museum, is thought to be the earliest Diego Rivera painting in the United States. Rivera (1886-1957) ranks among the world's greatest artists in the first half of the 20th century.

Andv Warhol: The Athletes

Andy Warhol: The Athletes, a series of ten portraits of famous athletes commissioned by Warhol's friend and collector Richard Weisman, were on view in the Museum's Great Hall entrance. In Warhol's signature screenprinting format-photos were printed on canvas and embellished further with paint—the portraits included representations of Muhammad Ali, O.J. Simpson, Dorothy Hamill, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Chris Evert, Jack Nicklaus, Willie Shoemaker, Rod Gilbert, Tom Seaver, and Pelé, marking the early convergence of celebrity and professional sports.

Thomas Sully: Painted Performance

February 8, 2014–May 11, 2014 Cowden Gallerv Curator: William Keyse Rudolph

The American Romantic painter Thomas Sully (1783–1872) had a lifelong connection to and love for the theatre, associations that were critical components of his artistic imagination. Thomas Sully: Painted *Performance* was the first retrospective of the artist in thirty years, and the first to present the artist's portraits and subject pictures together. On view were nearly eighty paintings from public and private collections. Thomas Sully: Painted Performance was organized by the Milwaukee Art Museum and curated by William Keyse Rudolph, The Marie and Hugh Halff Curator of American Art, and Carol Eaton Soltis, Project Associate Curator, Center for American Art, Philadelphia Museum of Art.

Bob Kuhn: Drawing on Instinct March 15, 2014–July 6, 2014 Small Special Exhibitions Gallerv Project Director: William Kevse Rudolph

Bob Kuhn: Drawing on Instinct revealed an artist working at the intersection of natural history painting traditions and contemporary artistic movements such as color-field theory. His detailed paintings of animals in landscape eventually made him one of America's most popular wildlife illustrators. Kuhn's drawings were integral to his art—the building blocks upon which his paintings were constructed. Bob Kuhn: Drawing on Instinct was organized by the National Museum of Wildlife Art in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, and organized by Curator of Art, Adam Duncan Harris.

One of the most influential artists of the 20th century, Henri Matisse (French, 1869–1954) fundamentally altered the course of modern art with his stylistic innovations. *Matisse: Life in Color* featured fifty paintings and sculptures and thirty works on paper spanning six decades of the artist's prolific career, including *The Serf* (1900-03), The Pewter Jug (1917), Large Seated Nude (1922-29), The Yellow Dress (1929–31), and Large Reclining Nude (1935). The majority of the artwork in the exhibition came from the Baltimore Museum of Art's renowned Cone Collection, formed by sisters Dr. Claribel Cone and Miss Etta Cone with the artist's input and considered to be among the world's finest Matisse collections.





Golden Gallery

Artists in 17th-century Europe changed aesthetics towards a focus on greater realism, dynamic forms, and dramatic compositions. This Baroque style—developed in and often associated with Rome-spread to affect visual and decorative arts, architecture, and urban design across Europe. *Glories of the Baroque* featured important contributions by two non-Romans, Parisian Paul Vouet's Two Philosophers and Florentine Vincenzo Dandini's St. Mark the Evangelist, as well as other works from the period in the Museum's collection.

The Art Books of Henri Matisse

June 21–September 7, 2014 Small Special Exhibitions Gallery Curator: William Keyse Rudolph

This exhibition presented a close look at form, color, and line through four of the twelve illustrated books created over the course of Henri Matisse's lifetime. *Poésies de Stéphane Mallarmé* (1932) included fourteen etchings created to accompany the works of the French poet. Pasiphaé, Chant de Minos (Les Crétois) (1944) retold the story of the wife of King Minos and the Minoan bull through striking linoleum engravings. Jazz (1947), considered one of the great illustrated books of the 20th century, signaled a new chapter in which Matisse created masterpieces from paper cutouts. Poèmes de Charles d'Orléans (1950) featured fanciful, curvilinear designs and handwritten transcription of the Renaissance poet's verse. The books were on loan from the Bank of America Collection.





• Targeted a young professional audience with **After-Hours Events** and Date Nights that combine art making, gallery experiences of special exhibitions, music, food, and drink.



If so, you experienced the fierceness and splendor of the samurai with *Lethal Beauty*, the elegance of Thomas Sully's portraits, the wildlife prowess of Bob Kuhn, the blockbuster art of Matisse, and much more.

What a game-changer these last twelve months have been for the Museum. One of the most thrilling numbers is our membership -6,415 strong. How wonderful that more than half of those enjoyed the exhibitions and our nearly 500 programs so much that they joined for the first time.


