Tangram Life Coaching was developed to provide support to young adults with mild or undiagnosed disabilities as they transition from high school to college to the workplace. At the end of 2013 we learned that we were the recipient of a grant from the Nina Mason Pulliam Charitable Trust that would allow us to implement a pilot project to bring life coaching to the University of Indianapolis and Midwest Academy. We anticipate many great outcomes with this project and look forward to updating you on our progress. Also in 2013, the Life Coaching website added a blog to its home page. Our newest initiative, Tangram Business Resourcing, has enjoyed a whirlwind year. A grant from the Indianapolis Foundation, an affiliate of the Central Indiana Community Foundation, allowed us to build our program in 2013. We are especially excited to announce that the grant from the Nina Mason Pulliam Charitable Foundation also extends to Tangram Business Resourcing as it will allow us to continue developing and building our career matching database, the Tangram Employment Database (TED). TED will match individuals with disabilities seeking employment to community employment.

Through these two initiatives, we look forward to finding innovative solutions to the challenges that individuals with disabilities face and to strengthening our community. With your help, we have created and will continue to create extraordinary lives. Thank you!





Tangram's Next Chapter Book Club
