Tips for Encouraging Play

"Play offers children opportunities to explore and practice concepts, to research and test ideas without worrying about a right or wrong answer, and to learn about others and themselves. Most importantly, play provides meaningful and integrated experiences that nurture whole-child growth and development." - Rachel Robertson - VP, Education and Development

- Allow your child to direct what and how to play, even if the purpose or objective of the play is not immediately obvious. Play is at its richest when children are in charge.
- Encourage some safe risk taking, e.g. climbing a tree or jumping on a play structure. Children gain confidence and learn to think independently with these experiences.
- 3. Allow children open-ended, unscheduled time to play. You can also ask open-ended questions, such as "What do you think?" "I wonder what sound that will make?"
- Read a variety of rich, engaging books to children, which can give them ideas for their pretend play.
