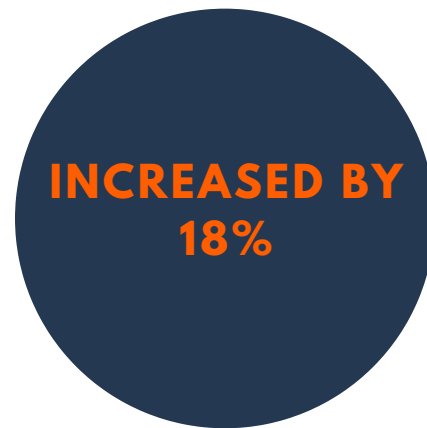

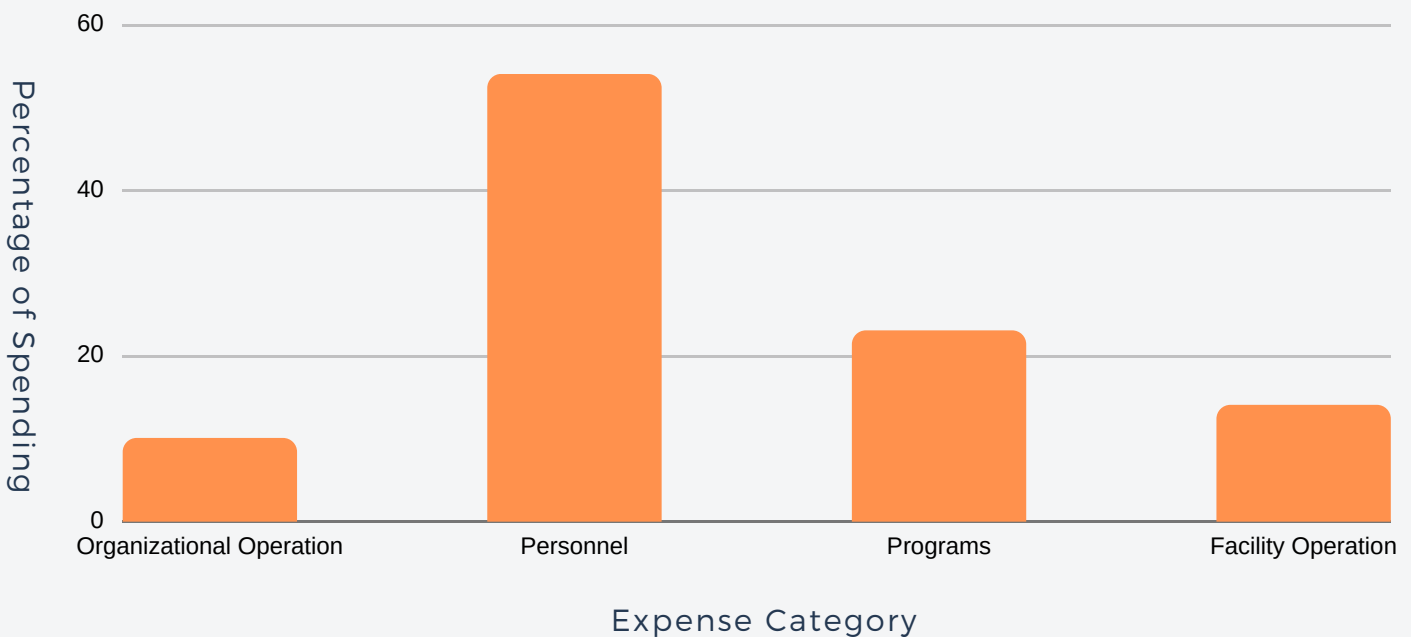
ANNUAL SPENDING
