What is the Catholic Youth Encounter?

The Catholic Youth Encounter (CYE) is the official archdiocesan youth gathering for all the high-school aged Catholic youth from parishes and schools within the Archdiocese of Hartford. It is a one-day event filled with live music, talks from an inspirational speaker, prayer and adoration, games, food, cool exhibits, time for confessions, and a closing Mass with the Auxiliary Bishop, Most Reverend Juan Miguel Betancourt, SEMV.

Why have a Catholic Youth Encounter?

Every diocese across the country hosts a one-day event for their bishop to gather with Catholic youth from all over their diocese. Youth need to see other young people at a large and local faith event. These kinds of events are impactful for their faith. Don't let the youth from your school or parish miss out!

When and where will it be held?

CYE will take place on **Sunday, April 26, 2020 from 11 a.m.-6:00 p.m.** at Saint Paul Catholic High School in Bristol, CT.

Who can attend?

Any Catholic high-school-aged youth and their adult chaperones from parishes and schools of the Archdiocese of Hartford are welcome to attend. Clergy and religious are welcome as well.

What will the day be like?

Prayer, live music, inspirational talks, games, food, exhibits, activities, adoration, and Mass will fill the day with faith-filled fun.


Who are adult chaperones?

Adult chaperones are anyone over the age of 18 who is "leading" or "chaperoning" a group of young people. High school seniors who are 18 years old and attending as participants are **not** chaperones.

What does the cost cover?

The \$30 fee will cover the food, live music, speaker and facility.
