Infant

Infants are adventurous beings who learn about the world—and themselves—through their senses. The infants learned to experiment with sound. They learned it by playing a big drum that makes a sound.



Toddler

The Bright Horizons Science Rocks curriculum provides a framework for teachers to weave scientific learning into all aspects of a toddler day. Through intentional experiences like rolling cars down a tube, teachers are helping the children become skilled observers, inquisitive investigators, and life-long researchers.



Twos

The Our World curriculum introduces complex concepts such as emotions and behaviors, encouraging children to reflect on themselves, their peers, and the world they live in. The children learn to identify emotions by name by talking about their feelings, with support from their teachers.



Preschool and KPrep

Well Aware provides preschoolers with varied opportunities and materials to develop concepts of wellness, as the knowledge and skills to practice healthy lifelong habits. Using the many Well Aware resources, teachers help children to develop their physical abilities, enhance their self-esteem, and nurture healthy habits – all of which contribute to a readiness to learn and confidence to master new challenges. By engaging in physical activities such as stretching, simple obstacle courses or yoga the children learn to strengthen and refine large muscle skills.

Literacy at Bright Horizons

At **Bright Horizons®**, we know that language and literacy are among the foundational skills needed for learning. Through them, children gain knowledge, develop their own thinking, and communicate and share ideas. While some children gain pragmatic literacy skills (like reading fluency) earlier than others, all children, from the earliest years, can enjoy and respond to stories, poetry, songs, conversations, and books.

We want children to leave Bright Horizons centers with a passion and love for stories and books. We also want them to be prepared with strong early literacy skills. What does this look like in a Bright Horizons classroom?

Rich conversations – We talk to children throughout the day, engaging in meaningful conversation, sharing our thoughts, and asking questions. Infant and toddler teachers use a “serve and return” approach, talking, laughing, and singing back and forth with children to nurture language development.

Storytelling experiences – Teachers read a variety of materials to children, including poetry, fiction, and nonfiction, often repeating favorite stories and encouraging children to act them out. Children use books on their own, as a source of pleasure and knowledge.

Phonological awareness activities – We promote phonemic awareness, or the ability to recognize the sounds in words, through rhyming games and activities and through hearing and repeating stories, songs, poems, chants, and finger plays.

Alphabet activities – We include alphabet books, puzzles, games, and activities so children have direct experience manipulating and seeing the letters of the alphabet. We choose materials that offer a high level of meaningful engagement.

Emergent reading and writing experiences – Teachers create literacy-rich environments and encourage children to use reading and writing in every aspect of their learning.

Ideas for home:

- ▶ Keep a well-stocked, rotating library of [high-quality children’s books](http://www.brighthorizons.com/family-resources) accessible to your child (www.brighthorizons.com/family-resources)
- ▶ Make reading a primary activity, taking care not to allow media use
- ▶ Sing nursery rhymes and [play rhyming games](http://www.brighthorizons.com/family-resources/language-development-early-childhood-speech-language-games-for-kids) (www.brighthorizons.com/family-resources/language-development-early-childhood-speech-language-games-for-kids)
- ▶ Offer writing materials (pencils, crayons, paper, or envelopes)
- ▶ Demonstrate how to write letters and encourage writing in natural ways, e.g., making a shopping list
