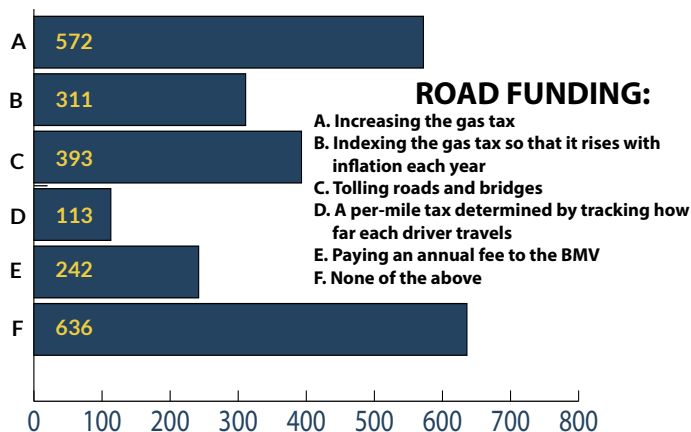




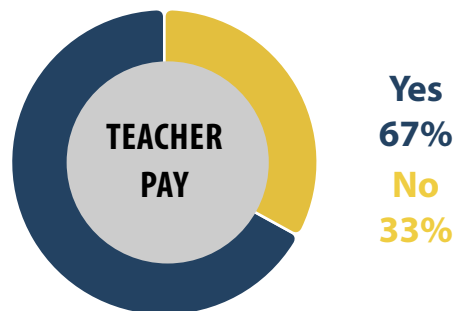

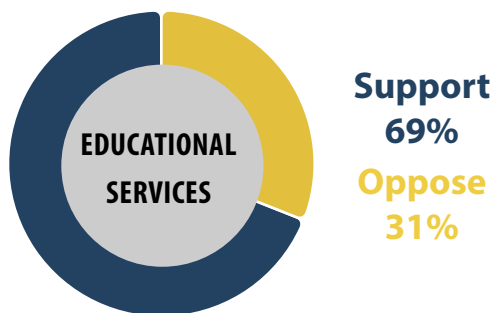
1. Which of the following changes would you support to increase road funding? (You may select more than one option.)



2. The U.S. is facing a shortage of teachers in subjects like math, science and special education. Do you think that Indiana should direct more school funding specifically to teacher pay?



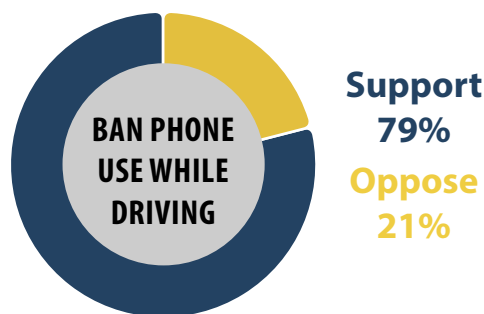
3. Do you support or oppose giving parents of children with special needs the option to use state educational funding for services such as school choice, tutoring or online courses?

5. Indiana bans texting while driving. Do you support or oppose expanding that law to ban all smart-phone activities while driving, with an exception for hands-free technology?



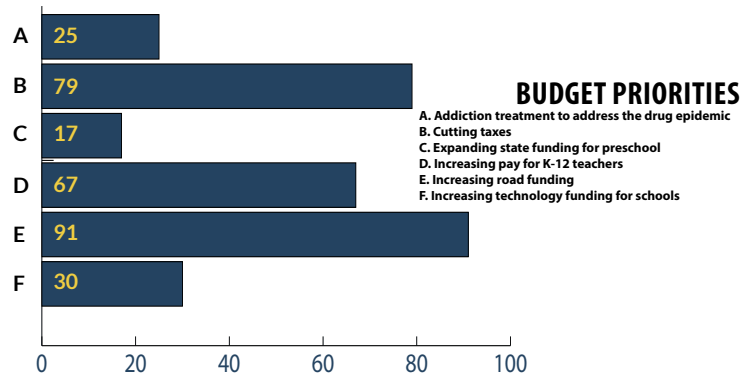

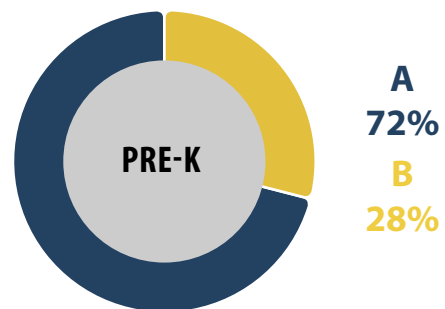

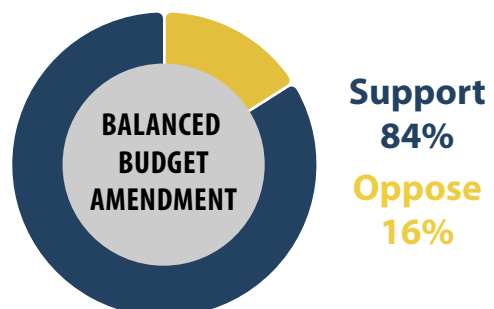
6. When the legislature adopts a new state budget during the 2017 session, which one of the following do you think should be the top priority?



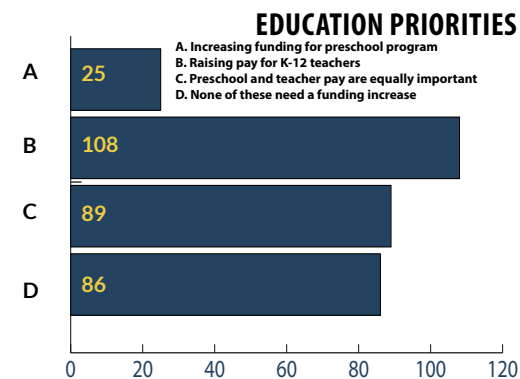

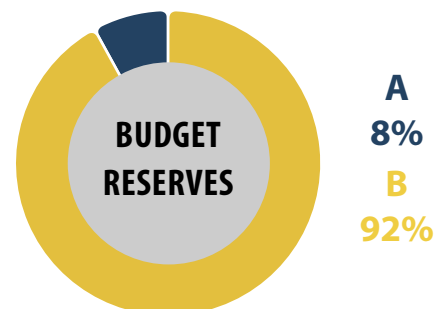
10. Do you support or oppose amending the Indiana Constitution to require the General Assembly to pass a balanced budget?



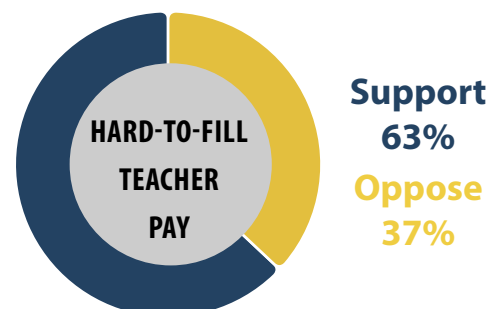
7. Which of the following do you think is more important?

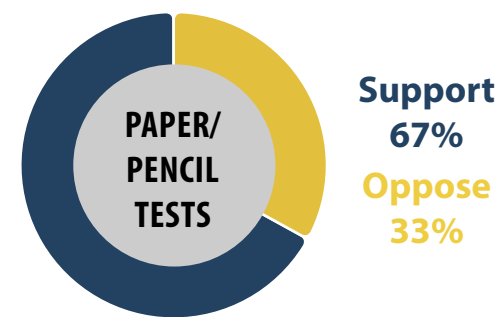

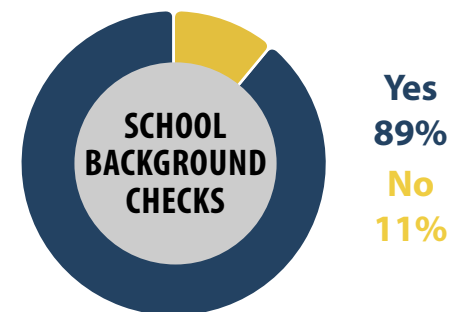

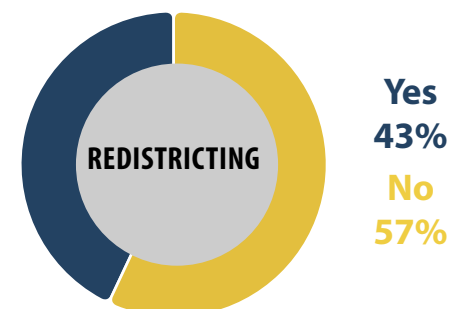

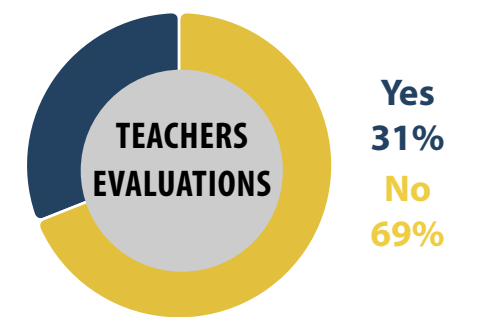
14. Do you think school employees who work with children should be required to pass criminal background checks every 5 years?



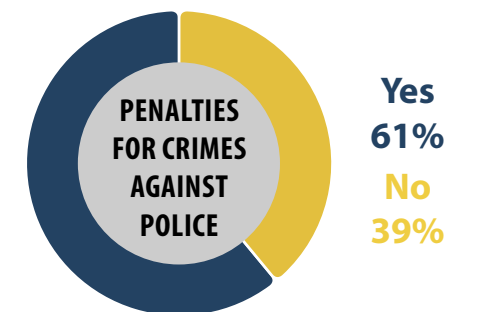
16. Should the Indiana Constitution be amended to establish an appointed commission to draw state legislative and congressional district boundaries?



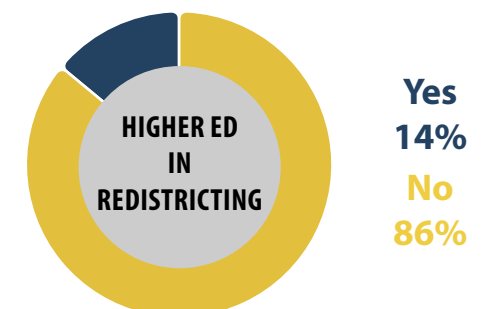
13. Should student scores from Indiana's statewide test be used as a part of teachers' job performance evaluations?

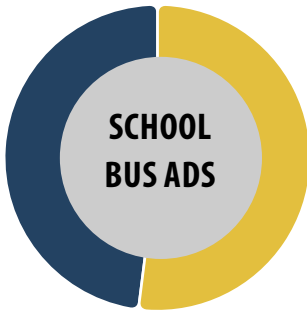
