Carretha Hale and the Indiana African-American Genealogy Society will present true-life family history about their enslavement with the Creek Native Americans. Because of her findings, Hale was inspired to write a book on her family discoveries in 2015 titled From Slavery to Statehood: A Family History in the Creek Nation. The group will also answer genealogy questions at the end.
