Sun Safety

In order to proved the optimal sun safety, we have found this practice to work best over the years. Parents should apply a good layer of sunscreen to your child each morning. Teachers are able to reapply a coat after nap time if you bring a bottle of sunscreen (be aware that spray or aerosol sunscreens are not allowed per sanitation regulation) and sign a permission form.

Warm Weather Clothing

It is time to swap out your child's extra clothes in their cubbies for shorts and t-shirts. It is important to send your child to school in tennis shoes or sandals that are secure to your child's foot. Flip flops are cute, but do not provide foot safety for trike riding.

Summer Transitions

We are busy planning transitions up to the next age group for the summer months. We have 23 children leaving for kindergarten, most of them won't leave us until the last week in August. This means we will be able to transition a handful of children during the summer months and then a great migration will happen the last week in August and the first week in September. Introducing the Music Makers Program

In 2018, the Education and Development team at Bright Horizons introduced Music Makers, the musical component of Art Smart, Bright Horizons' visual and performing arts curriculum. At Bright Horizons, we believe that music exposure is an important part of every child's development.

Music is much more than singing. Music matters because it is universal. Every culture has some form of music, and it naturally interests and delights children. Music has a language of its own and is a wonderful outlet for creative energy. Music builds relationships, nurtures developmental skills, and encourages cultural exchanges. Howard Gardner, developer of the concept of multiple intelligences, considers music one of the eight intelligences.

Music Makers offers teachers practical and theoretical information about the value of music and how to present it in the early childhood classroom.

A dynamic music program will:

- Teach children the basic properties of music, such as tempo, pitch, and volume.
- Build children's self-esteem and ability to express feelings.
- Support peer interaction and social skills knowledge.
- Develop language and vocabulary.
- Expose children to cultures and languages.
- Introduce children to musical instruments.

In your child's classroom, you might see:

- Sound areas in the infant and toddler rooms that include musical instruments, wind chimes, or whistles.
- Musical instruments, songbooks, microphones, and other materials as appropriate for each age group.
- Explorations of musicians, composers, and musical groups, such as orchestras and quartets.
- Children singing songs, dancing, playing instruments, creating instruments, or reading books related to music.
- Children exploring patterns, rhythms, and tones.

Introduce children to musical instruments. The Music Makers curriculum is just one way we keep our promises to nurture and care for the whole child and create joyful places for childhood. Talk with your child's teacher or director to learn more about Music Makers.

Did You Know?

The Partnership for a Healthier America (PHA) works with private companies to eliminate the problem of childhood obesity, and complements the Let's Move! initiative started by former First Lady Michelle Obama. In 2011, Bright Horizons was the first early care organization to join PHA and in 2017 we renewed our commitment until 2020.
