
The UK is a truly great place to study



A unique head start with the UK's Graduate Route

The UK's Graduate Route allows international students to apply to stay in the UK and work, or look for work, upon graduation.

It's a wonderful opportunity for international students, and those who have successfully completed an undergraduate or master's degree will be able to apply to stay in the UK for up to two years. PhD graduates will be able to apply to stay for up to three years.

Flexibility is built into the majority of these courses and many UK universities allow students to choose from different subject 'modules', so they can build a course programme that suits them, specialising as the course develops for a perfectly tailored experience. It means that, no matter what students are passionate about, the UK is a fantastic place to pursue any academic or career interest.



Subject content

International graduates know that a UK degree is a valuable and transformative investment and studying here is good value for money – with average costs here being lower than in both the USA and Australia.

Additionally, UK graduates are amongst the most employable in the world,* which means a student's investment is more likely to result in a rewarding and successful career.

Applying to UK universities

Every year, over 500,000 undergraduates and postgraduates choose the UK over other countries, and students here will meet people from all backgrounds, and from all walks of life.*

To help you to explain the UK's university application process, we have created a guide, outlining the steps students should take which you can find on our website.

Applying to UK universities through Clearing

Some international students may not be aware of Clearing, and that they can still apply to university in the UK even if they have declined (or not been offered) a place. To help you explain this, we have created a <u>short and informative animated film</u> which explains the process.

Applicants can use Clearing if:

- they're applying after 30 June
- they didn't receive any offers (or none they wanted to accept)
- · they didn't meet the conditions of their offers
- they've declined a university place that was already offered.

You should encourage applicants to:

- ask for advice and see what courses are available by using the search tool on UCAS and check entry requirements
- consider different subjects
- talk to the universities they are interested in
- take a virtual tour
- attend a virtual open day.



Scholarships and financial support

GREAT Scholarships

GREAT Scholarships are offered to international students from 14 countries and across a variety of subjects. Students from Bangladesh, China, Egypt, Ghana, India, Indonesia, Kenya Malaysia, Mexico, Nigeria, Pakistan, Thailand, Turkey and Vietnam are eligible to apply.

Each scholarship is worth a minimum of £10,000 towards tuition fees, for a one-year taught postgraduate course. Our aim is to significantly increase the number of opportunities for students, by promoting a world-class university education to an international audience and reinforcing the message that the UK continues to welcome the brightest and best international students.

GREAT Scholarships for justice and law

GREAT Scholarships for justice and law are designed for students who want to study in the UK for a one-year postgraduate course in a range of justice and law related subjects, including human rights, criminal justice and commercial law, at one of the 13 participating higher education institutions.


In the 2023-24 academic year, 20 postgraduate scholarships for justice and law are available for students from China, Ghana, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan, Thailand and Turkey. Each offers a minimum of £10,000 towards tuition fees.

GREAT Scholarships for climate change

GREAT Scholarships for climate change are designed for students who want to study in the UK for a one-year postgraduate course in a range of climate change related subjects, at one of the 13 participating higher education institutions.

In the 2023-24 academic year, 20 postgraduate scholarships for climate change are available for students from China, Ghana, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan, Thailand and Turkey. Each offers a minimum of £10,000 towards tuition fees.





More scholarships and financial support

Global scholarships

Students can apply for any of the following scholarships, provided they are course-appropriate:

Chevening Award: Postgraduate scholarships from the UK government aimed at students with potential as future leaders.

Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan: Postgraduate scholarships for nationals of Commonwealth countries, funded by the UK government and intended to support individuals who will subsequently make a contribution to the development of their home country.

Helping students prepare for their UK education

The students you are working with could benefit from a free, four-week online course that teaches them what they need to know about higher education in the UK.

Hosted on the FutureLearn online course platform, it teaches students about everything from teaching methods, course structures and how coursework will be assessed. It will also provide them with tips for studying in the English language and practical information about living in the UK.


During the course, there will also be plenty of opportunities for them to interact with other, like-minded individuals who are preparing for their UK education. They could even start making friends before they arrive in the UK.

The online course is entirely free and takes only four weeks to complete, although students can complete it faster if they wish. Upon successful completion, students will receive a digital certificate.

The course is provided twice a year and the next available dates can be found on the registration page. Students can register here.

Visas

Most international students will need a student visa to study in the UK. To find out more about immigration requirements, please visit the GOV.UK website. If students have questions about their visa application, please direct them to their local UK Visas and Immigration service.





Helping students get ready to travel

Immigration health surcharge

International students will need to pay a healthcare surcharge as part of their immigration application. This costs £470 per year for a student, giving access to NHS services without further charge (subject to a few exceptions such as prescription charges in England).

Surcharge levels are competitive, compared with health insurance requirements in comparable countries. The surcharge represents about one per cent of the total cost of studying in the UK (for a three-year undergraduate course). For more information, visit the GOV.UK website.

If students are from the EU, they may be able to apply for a refund of this cost. However, there are some conditions to be aware of.

Language requirements

As part of their student visa application, most students will be required to prove their English language ability.

There are a range of providers students can use to prove their English language ability. These include:

- IELTS
- Pearson PTE English test
- Duolingo English test
- TOEFL (China)

Students should check with their chosen university for advice on how to provide evidence of their English proficiency.



Helping students with their budgeting

To help you explain the cost of living in the UK, we have created a money and budgeting animation that you can share with international students as well as a flyer that you can print out for them.
