 - 2020 would have marked the Los Angeles Philharmonic's 99th season performing at the Hollywood Bowl
- About the Hollywood Bowl:

One of the largest natural amphitheaters in the world, with a seating capacity of over 17,000, the Hollywood Bowl is the summer home of the Los Angeles Philharmonic, which first performed at the venue in 1921. Today the Hollywood Bowl plays host to the finest artists from all genres of music, offering something for everyone. The LA Phil is committed to keeping the Hollywood Bowl accessible to every member of its Los Angeles community, offering \$1 tickets for many of the venue's classical and jazz performances as well as a free ticket distribution program for social service organizations. For millions of music lovers across Southern California, the Hollywood Bowl is a summertime tradition.

- Canceled Ticket Information:
 - Los Angeles Philharmonic Association Events:
 - Ticketholders can donate their seats back to the LA Phil (100% tax deductible gift), receive credit for a future event (through the 2020/21 Walt Disney Concert Hall and Hollywood Bowl 2021 seasons), or receive a full refund. We strongly encourage those who can, to donate their tickets back to the organization. The value of donated tickets will also go towards a new \$1 million challenge grant established by Jane and Michael Eisner.

Situated in a 32-acre park and under the stewardship of the Los Angeles Philharmonic, The Ford presents an eclectic summer season of music, dance, film, and family events that are reflective of the communities that comprise Los Angeles.

 - No tickets to the 2020 season were sold.
 - The 2020 season announcement was canceled due to the stay at home restrictions put in place by Governor Gavin Newsom, Mayor Eric Garcetti, and Los Angeles County health officials.
