There will, in fact, be two championships in Birmingham. The CKF Championship which is open solely to National Teams, followed by the CKF 'Club' Championship which provides opportunity for all members of the CKF.

Our event will be held in the recently built Sports and Fitness Centre, University of Birmingham, Edgbaston Campus. Official accommodation is within walking distance of the venue, as are various shops and restaurants. The city centre is a short distance away and easily accessible.

Birmingham has a rich history and offers a variety of cultural, sporting and leisure opportunities. There are several premier league football clubs, Edgbaston cricket ground, a number of theatres, and countless bars and restaurants. For those that might wish to explore a little further, then Shakespeare country is 45mins away, and London can be reached within 90mins.

As England's second city, Birmingham will host the Commonwealth games in 2022. The ambition of the CKF is to one day see Karate introduced to the Commonwealth Games proper. We are taking this opportunity to showcase our sport in the host city to further our ambition. TOURNAMENT RULES & SCHEDULE

Throughout the Commonwealth Karate Championships, the World Karate Federation (WKF) rules will be applied and as such only WKF approved protective equipment (inclusive of chest, leg, feet and hand protection) will be permitted.

The WKF and the English Karate Federation (EKF) comply with the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) code of practice and adopt a strict stance on anti-doping. Therefore, WADA rules will be stringently applied throughout the championships.

The CKF Championship will comprise of two events, namely the 10th Commonwealth Karate Championship which will only be open to National Team athletes and the Commonwealth Karate Club Championships will be open to all Commonwealth karateka that are members of the WKF.

At the Commonwealth Karate Championships there will only be two athletes allowed in each category per National Team. However, in the Commonwealth Club Championships (which will take place after the Elite event is concluded) there will be no limit on the number of entries per category.

The two-day Commonwealth Karate Championship event will take place on Wednesday 7th and Thursday 8th September. The Commonwealth Club Championship will follow and take place on Friday 9th, Saturday 10th and Sunday 11th September.

Competition Schedule:

The detailed competition schedule will be fixed after closing the online registration in order to finalise the number of athletes. Only the categories appointed will be allowed to stay in the stadium during the authorised timetables. Detailed information will be communicated at due time.

Online Registration

All registration in the CKF Championship must be processed ONLINE via Sportdata. Onsite registrations will NOT be accepted. The registration will be validated once completed with the online payment through the payment platform.

National Federations are responsible for the quality of the entered registration data.

The online registration of athletes will be openly disclosed for everyone from the beginning, allowing consultation by CKF National Federations of the competitors registered in real-time.

To assist in the Officiating of this Event it would be appreciated if all Delegated Countries could make available Judge / Referees. To register an Official each Country should complete the relevant section on Sportdata. (* Note, National Referee qualification is acceptable).

Any issue regarding the online registration must be notified to the software provider and to the CKF at the latest five days before the first day of competition to enable consideration without altering the smooth running of the process. Sportdata will provide live timing with a rundown of days before the start of the event the online registration will close. Please note that no entries will be accepted after the closing date. Entry Fee :

The entry fee is £25.00 for individual categories and £50.00 for Team events.

All payments must be processed through the online payment platform. Onsite payments will not be accepted.

Official Accreditation

The official accreditation will take place on 8th September 2022 from 09:00 to 20:00 at the Sport and Fitness Centre. If changes are required during the official registration session, because of incorrect or missing registration data, a fee of £30 is charged for each change. At registration, accreditation cards will be issued with the participant's main data, a photograph, and information about registered categories. The accreditation card must always be worn during the event. Only members of national federations recognised by CKF are permitted to participate, as per the CKF Organising Rules 2022. All participants must submit an official document (passport or other valid ID card) for the CKF identification and validation at the accreditation session. Any competitor who has not collected, either personally or through his/her coach their accreditation during the official registration, will not be included in the draw. The weighing will be carried out immediately after receiving the accreditation, those athletes who will not attend the weighing will not be included in the draw.

Media

The Event will be live streamed on Youtube, due to CKF Live Streaming, video recording will not be allowed under any circumstance.

Press

Press accreditation can only be given to professional journalists working for a media and having proof of their credentials. Media professionals can register to request press accreditations through the online registration on Sportdata.

Spectator Tickets

It is anticipated that the event will be open to the public, but it will depend on the COVID-19 pandemic situation and the measures that will be defined by the United Kingdom National Health Service. Further details regarding the purchasing of tickets will be announced in due course.

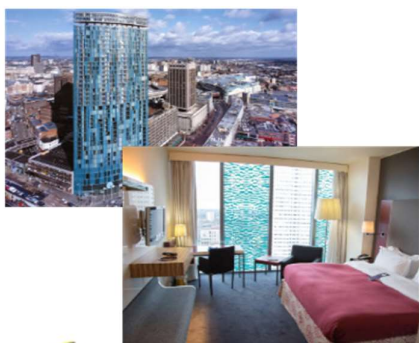

UK VISA INFORMATION

REQUIREMENTS

If you wish to enter the UK, you may need to apply for a Visa before travelling. Visa requirements are dependent on country of origin. For the Commonwealth nations within the European Economic Area (EEA) but outside of the UK (Cyprus and Malta) you do not need a Visa and can travel to the UK on either a valid passport or a national identity card.

Non-residents of the EEA must also travel on a valid passport which needs to be valid for the duration of your stay. The following countries will require a Standard Visitor Visa for entry into the UK:

The earliest you can apply for a UK Visa is 3 months before travel and a decision can take up to 3 weeks to be made. Therefore, we advise that you begin the process as early as possible in the 3-month designated window.

All countries not listed above are entitled to stay in the UK for a period of 6 months without a Visa. However, you should also bring the same documents with you that you would need to apply for a Visa to show these to the UK Border Force Agency at the airport.

Travelling with children

If you have a differing name to the child you are travelling with, then you may be asked to prove the relationship between you. Means of doing this to satisfy the authorities are documented below:

- a birth or adoption certificate showing your relationship with the child.
- divorce or marriage certificates if you're the parent but have a different surname from the child
- a letter from the child's parent giving permission for the child to travel with you and providing contact details, if you're not the parent.

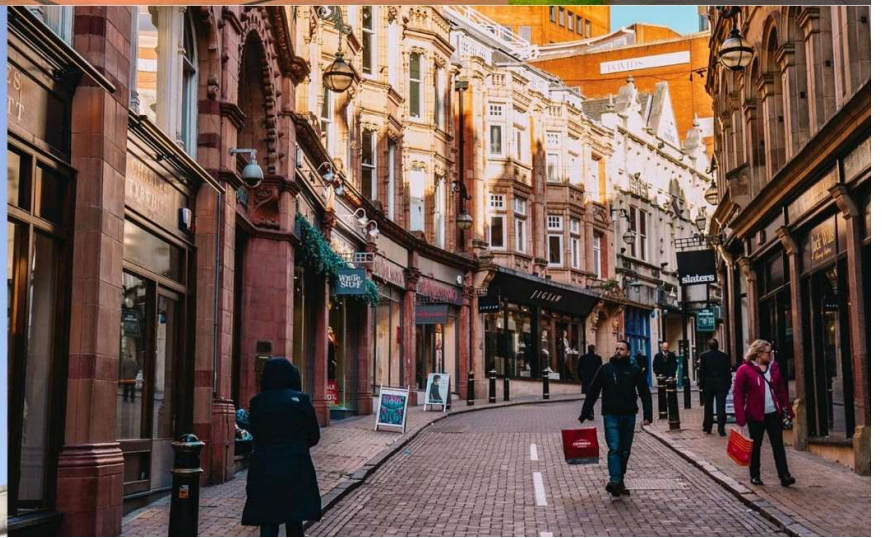
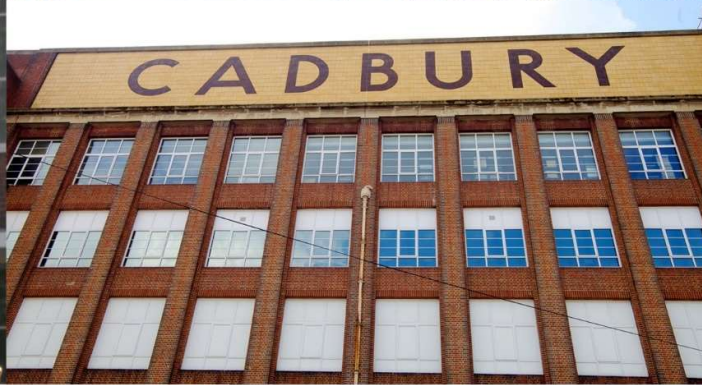

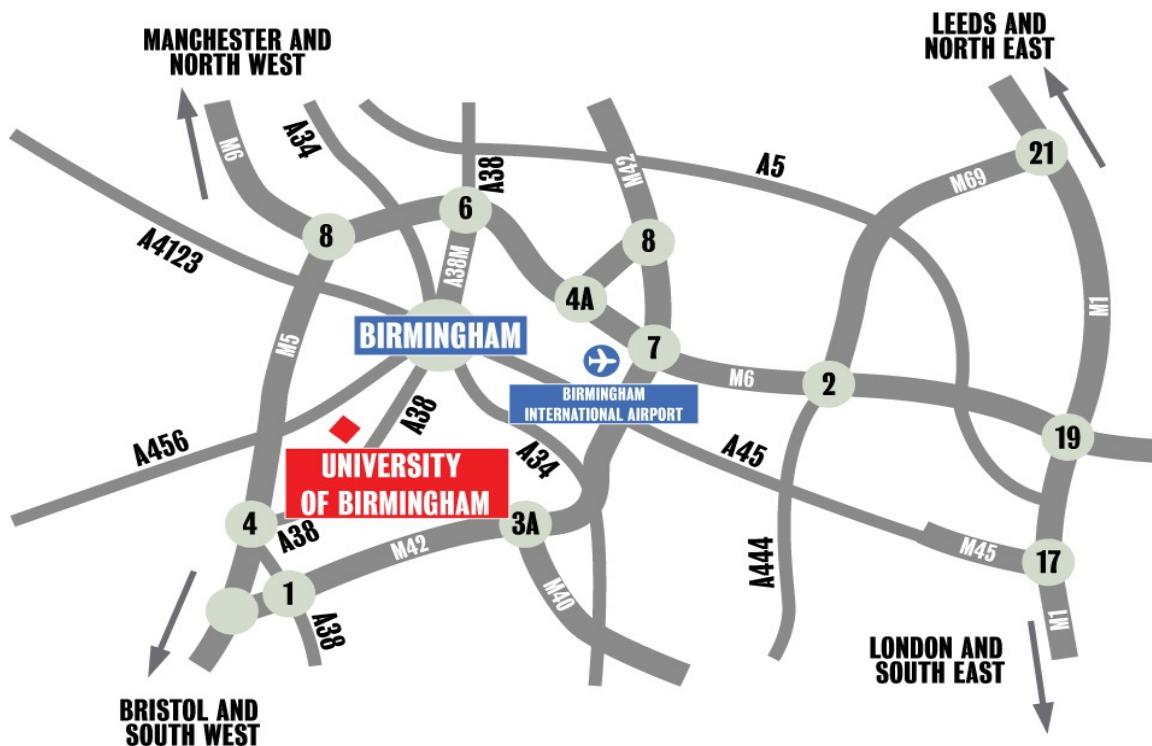
