Mrs. Reece 6th LA — We are moving forward with our nonfiction unit. <u>Mrs. Fields – 6th Math</u> – All classes are going to wrap up a unit on coordinate planes before leaving for break. <u>Mrs. Dannaker – 6th Science</u> – We will be wrapping up our Physical Science unit this last week before winter break. After we return we will begin our third nine weeks with Life Science. Have a wonderful and relaxing break.

<u>Miss Severance – 7th Language Arts</u> – This week, students in periods 3, 4, 5, and 7 took their test over <u>The Outsiders</u>. They also worked on revisions for their essay called "Music of the Soul". Next week, we will hopefully be learning about direct and indirect objects. HALA students finished their memoirs and began revisions over the same essay.

Mr. Bruns – 7th Social Studies – This week we continued to learn about South Asia with a focus on the country of India and its colonial past. We have been learning about how colonialism impacted the nation of India and also learned about one of the key people who helped to bring about independence for that country. There will be a test on 12/19/2017 over this information and that means the students were given a study guide on 12/12/2017 that will help them to focus their studying.

Mrs. Beiser – 7th Science – Monday is the final drive of the egg cars. Who's egg will crack and who's will not? Tuesday through Friday students will be relating what they know about Newton's Laws of Motion to the movie Toy Story 2. A 10-15 minute clip of the movie will be shown then the students pick one scene to write and draw about. The project will be put on poster board and displayed. Look on canvas for the rubric and project guidelines under files. Use class time wisely and be creative! As Buzz would say, "Reach for the sky!"

<u>Mrs. Harvey – 7th Business</u> – I cannot believe that my time with 7th grade is coming to an end! We've spent lots of time typing, reviewing basic internet safety concepts, and using Microsoft Office software. Next week, we will wrap up all of our projects and do some final practice in Word and Excel before heading out for break. I look forward to working with these students again when they're 8th graders!

Mrs. Graham - 7th & 8th Math - All students have been working with slope/constant of proportionality. We have learned to define slope as ration of the vertical change (RISE) over the horizontal change (RUN). We have distinguished the difference between linear functions and nonlinear functions and how their graphs are different. Students have also learned how to tell whether a function has a proportional relationship or not. We are now calculating slope based on a graph and deciding about proportionality. We will continue to build this concept through graphing, equations and tables when we return from winter break.

The Math-RED, YELLOW and BLUE classes have started learning about writing 2-step equations based on a story problem. We will continue this next week. When we return from winter break, we will continue working with equations and story problems. The Math-GREEN and ORANE groups are solving 2-step equations. We will continue this concept when we return in January, adding writing our own equations based on a story problem.

<u>Mr. Whalbring – 8th Language Arts</u> – This week and next week in 8th-grade English, we've been looking at some additional Latin Roots, with a quiz Friday. In reading, we've been studying the elements of story, including character, plot, conflict, setting, and resolution. We've been breaking these elements down through reading the short story, "Flowers for Algernon." Students this week have also been working on character analyses, which they present to the class in groups.

<u>Ms. Estep – 8^{th} Math</u> – Students are continuing to solve linear equations in one variable. Algebra: Students are finishing the linear function unit. The test will be on December 19th and 20th.

<u>Mrs. Crumley – 8th Science</u> – Students took their chapter 5 test this week. All missing work and quizzes are due by the end of the day Wednesday December 20th. Extra credit is also due on this day. Students were given the extra credit opportunity in class; it is also listed on Canvas. We will be programing with the Ollie and Spheros before break.

Mr. Gutzwiller – 8th Social Studies – Unit four is rapidly coming to a close. Our test will be on Tuesday, December 19th with review guides and core vocabulary due on Monday. Students have access to a video that I created giving an overview on the objectives for the unit. Next Wednesday marks the end of the grading period. Mrs. Persinger – 8th Art - Students will be working on and finishing the Illuminated Manuscript project (last project of UCMS Art!).
