• Lack of companions on the faith journey


• Families with marginal practice of faith

• Unable to answer "so what?"

knows them well.

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The spiritual, mental and physical health consequences of this disconnection are severe.



Young people are alone at their most vulnerable moments. Young people who experience isolation and loneliness are 3.5x more likely to be severely stressed.

Loneliness has the same impact on mortality as smoking 15 cigarettes a day, making it even more dangerous than obesity.

Research shows a consistent link between isolation, loneliness and mental health issues including depression, suicide and suicidal ideation.



Nearly 40% of young people report that they have no one to talk to and attending religious groups or gatherings does not have any effect. ...unless they have a relationship with an adult who cares.

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Impact of Trusted Adults Checking In
Nearly 8 out of 10 young adults (18-25 years of age) who have had a trusted adult check on them report feeling less lonely.

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Many youth feel disconnected from their communities.


Many families are disengaged from the parish and are not empowered to share faith at home.

Many youth do not pray regularly; they are often distracted from integrating an experience of God




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








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Determine a Ministry Context to Begin Accompaniment
