2. Double down on digital efforts.

- If your parish is not already on Facebook, now is the best time to create a parish Facebook page.
- Plug in to meeting hosting software such as Zoom, GoToMeeting, or Google Hangouts (etc.)
- Review the OEEC's library of digital resources.
- Take suggestions from your community.
- Use your email blast system (Flocknote, Constant Contact, the parish website host, etc.) to cultivate weekly newsletters.



A quick note on social media:

- Avoid the temptation to try to be all things to all people.
- Don't try to reinvent the wheel; just be your most authentic self as a community in the digital sphere.
- Asses what your parish does best in "normative times"; replicate those few things really well.

3. Get creative with what you offer.

Not everything has to be "overtly religious" but can instead be "back-door formation" or "back-door catechesis."













5. Let all that you offer be focused on joy and hope.


- Let the contagion you spread be the joy of the Gospel.
