In the Spring of 2018 the LA Phil tours to Boston, Washington D.C. and New York before crossing the Atlantic and returning to London and Paris. This will be the orchestra's third International Associate Residency at London's Barbican, presenting three concerts including a Green Umbrella program and a cross-cultural exchange involving young musicians from Los Angeles and Great Britain working with Gustavo Dudamel as part of a national youth orchestra conference. This two-day convening will aim to explore the role of music and the arts in young people's lives. The tour includes the orchestra's second visit to Paris' newest concert hall, the Philharmonie.
