Yellow Room

Summer water days have commenced! Water days will be held once a week through September, and with the weather warming up, the children have been looking forward to them. These days provide the children with a new activity and experience outside of the ordinary playground time. It allows them to explore different senses and have control over how much or how little they want to get wet. We have loved seeing the different ways they choose to play and manipulate the water activities that we have been providing for them.





Blue Room

We have observed the Blue Room children pretending to dig and haul dirt with construction trucks all over the playground. To give the children space to explore this interest, we discussed building a sandbox on the yard. We gathered our materials and started "construction". The children were so excited to observe the process! As they watched the assembly of the sandbox, they were observing the adults modeling mathematical thinking and simple engineering. It was also a practice in patience – they couldn't wait to start digging. Our new sandbox is another gathering place that encourages children to communicate, work together, share, be creative, and have fun!





Orange Room

The Orange Room has been interested in creating unique pieces of art. Here, the children painted with marbles by rolling them inside of a box. They soon realized that by using a larger box, this experience required two people using their whole bodies to maneuver the marble in the direction of their choosing. With communication and coordinated movements, the children created unique abstract works of art together.


