## What You Will See in Walt Disney Concert Hall

There are several unique features that you will notice when you enter the concert hall. As you take your seat, keep your eyes peeled for the following:



### Theater-in-the-Round Seating

The audience sits “**in the round**,” meaning that the main performance happens in the center of the auditorium and concertgoers enjoy the performance from all different angles.

The best part of this seating is that no one has a bad seat, and it gives a sense of community between the performers onstage and the audience members.

### “Hurricane Mama,” the Walt Disney Concert Hall Organ

Behind the orchestra, you will notice a beautiful piece of art that might look like French fries. These are the pipes of a **pipe organ**, which is an unusual instrument.

While many musicians’ instruments travel with them, pipe organs are stationary and built into the buildings that they call home.

Walt Disney Concert Hall’s organ has a few nicknames: “Hurricane Mama,” due to its bellowing sound, and “The French Fries,” due to its design.

It has a whopping **6,134 pipes** with the ability to play from the lowest of lows to the highest of highs during performances.

Make sure you have used the restroom and are seated before the music starts!

Imagine sneaking into a secret clubhouse—you don't want to miss any of the magic.

### **DO** Share Your Quiet Superpower

Show off your ability to sit still and quietly enjoy the concert.

You will be a concert hall superhero by helping everyone enjoy the music, too!

### **DO** Listen with Curiosity

The orchestra has a story to tell, and your job is to figure out what it's about. Is that a harp? What is the conductor doing? Why is the music so fast?

It's okay to wonder—just save your questions for after the show!

### **DO** Clap Like a Pro

When the music stops and the conductor turns around, that's your cue!

Clap, smile, or cheer (politely!) during the final bow. Musicians love knowing their hard work makes you happy.


### **DO** Be Yourself
