The immigrant experience is different for those of us whose birth place is identified as "the enemy." Most new immigrant groups struggle to establish themselves in the new country; their customs scrutinized and the sound of their language tolerated with disdain. Muslims in the US in the early 21st century face a different challenge. A war was declared against "terror" in the first year of the new millennium; Muslims were identified as its agent and consequently targeted inside and outside of the United States. The whole world in fact became the battlefield upon which Muslim identity was attacked. Similar to the Japanese in 1940's or Vietnamese in the 1960's, Muslims in the US are viewed with suspicion. But unlike the Vietnamese and Japanese, Muslims are not citizens of one country. Global statistics on Muslim populations tell us that nearly half of the 1.5 billion Muslims living in the world today are concentrated in four countries: Indonesia, Pakistan, India and Bangladesh. You may notice that none of these countries are Arab or part of the Middle East. In fact, there are three times as many Muslims living in Nigeria than Saudi Arabia. Identifying "the enemy" has always been complicated but more so in the case of Muslims precisely because of the diversity of the populationand of course our lack of knowledge about the very people we are targeting.

In LANGUAGE ROOMS, Yussef el Guindi transports us to a secret place to encounter the otherand ourselves. "The language itself puts us in enemy territory," says the Arabic-speaking Nasser. Yet language is precisely how Yussef carves an opening to the other side. This is one reason Yussef has captured the national imagination and garnered numerous awards including Best American Play for LANGUAGE ROOMS. We are most proud and excited that Yussef el Guindi is the next Middle East America (MEA) Distinguished Playwright award recipient. This provides Yussef with two years of development support at the Lark Play Development Center in New York and production opportunities at Silk Road Rising in Chicago and here at Golden Thread.

New play development is a long term and costly investment. It requires the partnership of visionary leaders in the community to underwrite the cost of workshops and productions. The Tree of Life campaign currently on display in the lobby is a great way to support new play development at Golden Thread, offering donors the opportunity to make a dedication on a lasting original art piece. When we first came across LANGUAGE ROOMS, we were immediately struck by how the story deftly maneuvered between a very funny black comedy, revolving around the War on Terror (think 'The Office' meets '24' meets 'Brazil'), and an uncommon twist to a bittersweet coming-to-America immigrant story. So when Golden Thread generously offered AATC the opportunity to collaborate on this production, we were very excited! Yussef el Guindi's play is the perfect vehicle for AATC and Golden Thread, two local companies who look at the diasporic Asian identities in the United States from different but overlapping angles, with which to form a collaboration.

LANGUAGE ROOMS was inspired by the story of Captain James Yee, the Asian American Muslim Army chaplain arrested in 2003 (since released and exonerated) for possible sympathies with the prisoners he was counseling at Guantanamo Bay. During the term of his imprisonment, Yee was held in solitary confinement for 76 days in the same conditions as the detainees for whom he was a counselor and advocate.

LANGUAGE ROOMS helps us see the absurd struggles we all go through to be a part of the American fabric, and the ongoing love-hate relationship we have with ourselves because of it.

Almost two-thirds of the Muslims in the world today live in Asia. Despite this, Americans tend to only think of Muslims as being of Middle Eastern descent. Yet again, Asians are a misunderstood, overlooked minority, while Muslims are mistakenly cast as a monolithic people.

Most often, the 'immigrating to America' story is told from the perspective of the younger generations since they are the ones most likely to speak out for their communities. What sometimes becomes lost in these contemporary reflections are the actual viewpoints from our parents and grandparents. We get self-centered translations of their struggles (for us), their hardships (for us), their courage and endurance (all for us), but little insight into their own inner thoughts and feelings. Yussef's script is unique in its telling; the story is ostensibly told through the son, but ultimately resonates most strongly from the voice of the father.

In today's child-centric American society, LANGUAGE ROOMS' brilliance is an excellent reminder that in our desire to 'fit in', it's still mom & dad who are willing to bear our burdens.

Middle East America: A National New Plays Initiative

The Middle East America Initiative is a first-of-its-kind tri-coastal collaboration created and managed by San Francisco's Golden Thread Productions, New York's Lark Play Development Center, and Chicago's Silk Road Theatre Project. It is designed to encourage and support the development of Middle Eastern-American playwrights and plays of the highest artistic caliber and to enrich the canon of American dramatic literature. The program aims to challenge both the lack of representation and the one-dimensional stereotypical representation of persons of Middle Eastern descent on America's stages.

The Middle East America Distinguished Playwright award is granted every other year to an American writer of a Middle Eastern background and comes with a \$10,000 commission to write a new play of the author's choice, artistic development support for two years and possible productions at both Silk Road and Golden Thread. During the commissioned play's development and production arc, representatives of each partner organization, along with the playwright will travel to each city—Chicago, New York, and San Francisco—to observe the play's creative process and to engage in public conversations and panel events about Middle Eastern-American voices.

Yussef el Guindi received the 2010 Middle East America Distinguished Playwright Award. He proposes to write a play that explores representations of the Middle East in today's America. The working title of Yussef's play is - THE PLAY YOU ARE WATCHING. Watch for it in 2014 at a theatre near you!

Education at Golden Thread Productions

Ten years have passed since the events of September 11 changed us and our relationship to the Middle East forever. While the Middle East has dominated the news for more than a decade, most Americans' knowledge of the region and its people remain superficial at best. Simultaneously, the rapid growth of immigrant communities of Middle Eastern background in the US has resulted in increasing numbers of children and youth from the region who remain under-served in their artistic and cultural education.

This year, Golden Thread developed an innovative theatre education curriculum rooted in Middle Eastern arts and literature. A core group of teaching artists, most bilingual and of Middle Eastern background, will be trained to lead classes and workshops. Additionally, Golden Thread will offer a two-day training program for teaching artists focused on Middle Eastern history, arts and literature taught by university professors and leading artists in the field.

By providing theatre education rooted in Middle Eastern arts and literature, Golden Thread's Education Program addresses the parallel needs of youth and equips arts educators with much needed overview of the region and its culture. The multifaceted program has three main arms: Teaching Residencies at schools and cultural organizations; the Fairytale Players creating and touring performances based on Middle Eastern stories; and Student Matinee Performances supported by detailed study guides tied to California Education Standards.
