### FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



Welcome to our final event of 2018! We designed this season to elicit meaningful conversation. We wanted to tackle large issues that reflect the national debate. But like the best theatre and the best works of art, *We Swim* resonates deeply on a very personal level. I have two young cousins in the U.S. military. Both are the sweetest, kindest, most generous-hearted people I know. And

every time I see their picture in uniform, it breaks my heart. Partly because I worry for their safety, but mostly because of what they represent in my mind: American foreign policy — which I find deeply problematic — and in particular, U.S. military presence in the Middle East for the past 30 years, which, in my mind, has been disastrous for the region.

So this is what happens. I look at someone I love and all I see is the politics they seemingly endorse by the choices they make. I am unable to discuss my true feelings on this subject with them — I am not as brave as Mona. Where does this leave us?

When I first read Mona's proposal for Middle East America: A National New Plays Initiative, I immediately thought about my cousins. Maybe if we watch this play together, I would be able to talk about my feelings, I thought. And as the play has evolved over the past four years, I have come to love and appreciate Mona's extraordinary talent even more, in that, she has created a play that through a deeply personal conversation examines some of our most deeply held values.

My deep gratitude goes to our Middle East America partners, The Lark in New York and Silk Road Rising in Chicago, for their investment in the development of this play. Their trust and support for what was merely an idea has resulted in a play that for me, and I hope some of you, is life-changing.

On that note, please lend your support to Golden Thread during these final days of the year. You are our most important partner in our creative endeavor and without your support many essential stories will go untold.

Thank you for being here and enjoy the show.

# SINK OR SWIM?

# Middle East America Initiative helps change the narrative.



We Swim, We Talk, We Go to War is a prime example of Golden Thread's commitment to changing the narrative as it pertains to Middle Eastern characters and stories.

American theatre has a complicated history with plays from or about the Middle East that has resulted in patterns of misrepresentation and exclusion. These plays rarely receive the institutional support to be created in the first place. That is why in 2008, Golden Thread partnered with Silk Road Rising (Chicago) and The Lark (NYC) to establish Middle East America: A National New Plays Initiative. The program awards a \$10,000 commission to a playwright of Middle Eastern descent. In addition, they get intensive development support from all three partners and possible production opportunities at either Golden Thread and/or Silk Road Rising. Playwrights are also provided with travel funds to attend workshops and productions in all three cities.

Mona Mansour is the third winner of the Middle East America Distinguished Playwright Award. Past winners are Armenian-American writer/actor Adriana Sevahn Nichols and Egyptian-American playwright Yussef El Guindi.

Hala Baki (Translation, Arabic Coach, and Assistant Director) is a theatre director and PhD candidate at UC Santa Barbara. Her research explores the relation of Arab American theatre with its social and political contexts. Recent directing credits include Baggage by Fateh Azzam, The Caucasian Chalk Circle by Bertolt Brecht, and The King's Elephant by Sa'adallah Wannous.
