



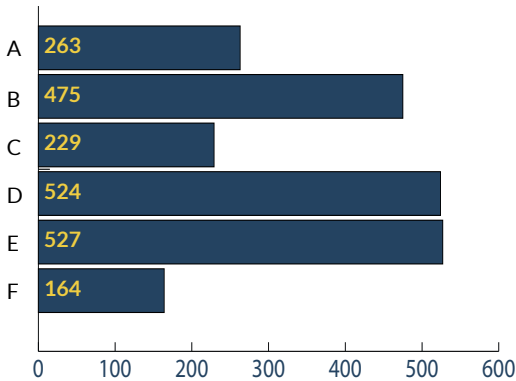

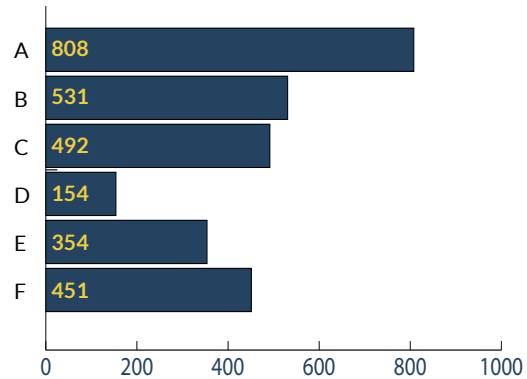

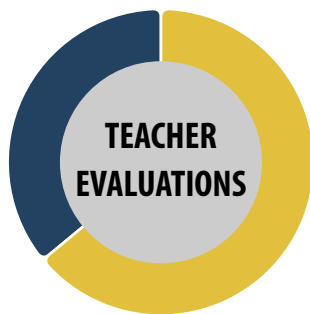
- 2.** Which of the following changes would you support to increase road funding? (You may select more than one option.)

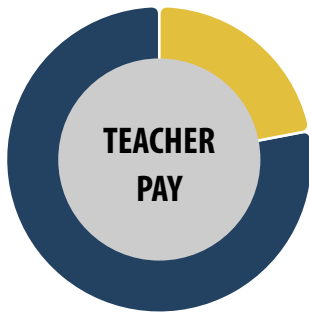

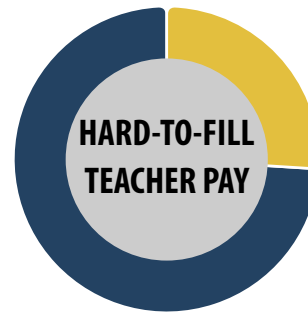
- 5.** The U.S. is facing a shortage of teachers in subjects like math, science and special education. Do you think Indiana should direct more school funding specifically to teacher pay?

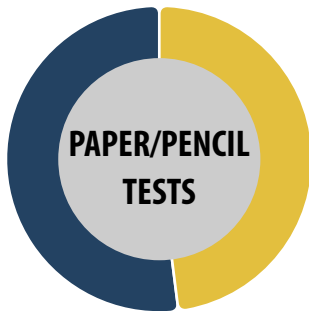
