The theme for the month of March is, **Spring is in the Air**! We will learn all about Dr. Seuss Birthday, Spring, St. Patrick's Day, Wetlands and Ponds.

The first week of March we will be discussing Dr. Seuss, in honor of his birthday. Students will become familiar with various forms of art by painting with corks. Using a cork, kiddos will be dipping it in green paint. They will stamp a circle inside an outline of a sunny side egg to represent green eggs. All week we will be reading some of our Dr. Seuss favorites such as, <u>Green Eggs</u>, <u>Ham and One Fish</u> and <u>Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish</u>.

Our weekly focus for the second week in March will be spring. We will be discussing rain, rain gear, rainbows, kites and flowers. Students will create squeeze rainbows by pouring paint that is colors of the rainbow into a Ziploc bag. Then, children will explore and mix colors together. Next, we will finger paint with our rainbow paint mixture on a large piece of butcher paper.

During our third week of March we will be learning about St. Patrick's Day. Kiddos will be using their five senses to explore a St. Patrick's Day sensory bin filled with beans, gold coins, green pipe cleaner shamrocks, green glitter, and green cotton balls to identify textures of different objects.

The final week of March will be all about wetlands and ponds. Student's will use magnifying glasses to observe the dirt and cooked pasta as the worms. They will explore and play with the different textures of the cooked pasta and dirt. We will also be creating lily pads at art; children will finger paint on a paper plate with blue and green paint. Then they will glue down cupcake liners (lily pads) on their ponds (paper plate).

We have a very fun and eventful March ahead of us, don't forget to dress your kiddos in green for St. Patrick's Day.
