Metanoia

Metanoia, (from the Greek μετάνοια: to change one's mind, repent, be converted) New Testament term referring to conversion, entailing repentance of sin and a subsequent turning toward the Lord.

Metanoia Retreat is a three day weekend spiritual retreat for young people who wish

- * to grow in their Catholic faith
- * be motivated
- * to discern their vocations
- * to put their faith into action

Metanoia would be open to participation from practicing and non-practicing Catholic youth as well as those preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

The retreat would be organized and facilitated by peer ministers, young adults, and adult leaders who would also lead the talks, prayers, and small group discussions. The retreat team would also include participation from clergy, religious, and married couples.
