

OISE ranked top education institute in Canada, 11th in the world by Times Higher Education

For the second consecutive year, the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education (OISE) at the University of Toronto has been ranked the 11th best educational institution in the world by the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings.

OISE also placed highest out of all institutions in Canada, and was the one of only two Canadian universities within the top 15 spots. The University of British Columbia placed 13, followed by McGill at 35.

"I am thrilled to see OISE consistently being recognized as a global leader in education," said **OISE Dean Glen Jones**. "This acknowledgement by the Times Higher Education attests to the strength of our faculty, programs, and research that continue to have a profound impact in education around the world."

The [Times Higher Education World University Rankings by Subject](#) highlights universities that are leading across education, teacher training, and academic studies in education subjects. Rankings are determined using 13 performance indicators grouped into five areas, which

include teaching, research, citations, international outlook, and industry income.

Gurkiran Kaur, president of the Graduate Students' Association, says that the support and opportunities offered at OISE are part of what make it a world-class education institution.

“Through progressive research and scholarship, OISE provides a platform for students to explore and challenge current knowledge and education systems,” she said. “In the classroom, students are encouraged to learn using both theoretical and applied methods, which gives them a unique and well-rounded learning experience.”
