What is the Form I-20?

To study as an F or M student in the United States you need a Form I-20, "Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status." Do you know what it is and why it is important? After officials notify you of acceptance to a <u>Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP)-</u> <u>certified school</u>, a designated school official (DSO) at that school will give you one of two different types of this form:

- **F Students:** If you receive acceptance into an academic or language school and will attend school in F-1 status, you will receive the Form I-20, "Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant (F-1) Student Status For Academic and Language Students."
- **M Students:** If you receive acceptance into a vocational school and will attend school in M-1 status, you will receive the Form I-20, "Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant (M-1) Student Status For Vocational Students. (Note: the Archdiocese of Hartford does not issue Form I-20's to M-1 status students.)

You will need the Form I-20 for any of the following:

- **Paying your <u>I-901 SEVIS Fee:</u>** You will receive a Form I-20 from a DSO from every school that accepts you. Use the Form I-20 from the school you decide to attend to pay the I-901 SEVIS Fee.
- <u>Applying for your nonimmigrant visa</u> at your U.S. Embassy or Consulate: Read the <u>embassy or consulate's website</u> for more specific instructions. You need to apply 120 days before the date listed on your Form I-20. Make sure the type of visa you receive matches the I-20 type you have (F or M).
- Entering the United States: Bring your Form I-20 with you when you enter the United States. You will present it to <u>U.S. Customs and Border Protection</u> officers at the port of entry when you arrive. You may arrive up to 30 days before the start date listed on your Form I-20.
- Applying for a <u>driver's license</u> or <u>Social Security number</u>: If you need to apply for a driver's license or Social Security number, you may need to bring the Form I-20 with you to prove you are legally enrolled in a program of study.

If you have any questions about the Form I-20, speak with the DSO at your school. Remember that only DSOs at <u>SEVP-certified schools</u> can issue a Form I-20 to an F or M student.
