



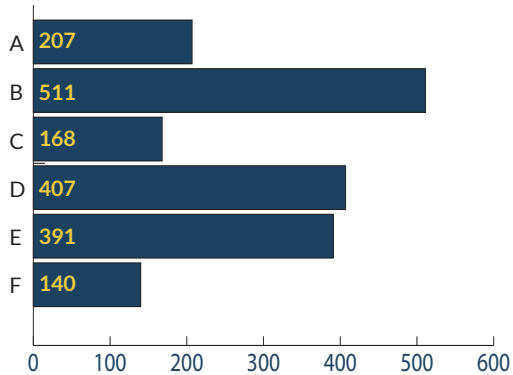

### BUDGET PRIORITIES

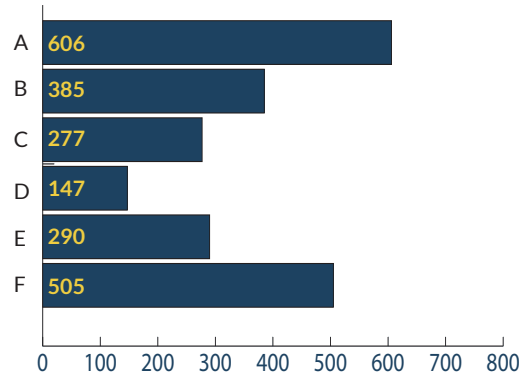

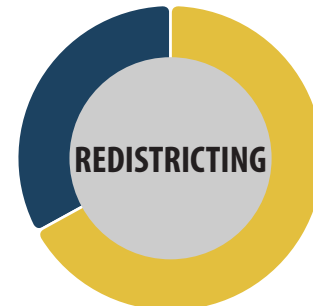

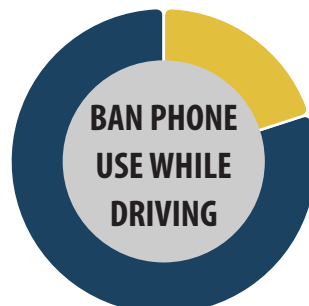
4. Should the Indiana Constitution be amended to establish an appointed commission to draw state legislative and congressional district boundaries?

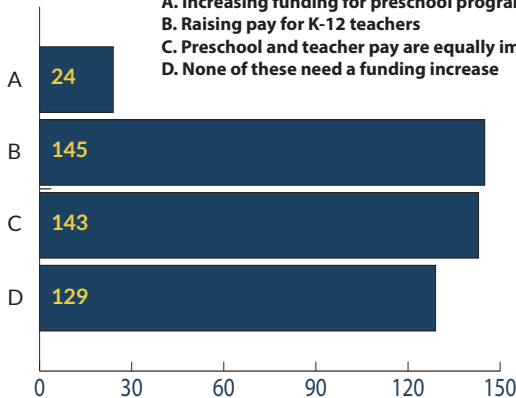

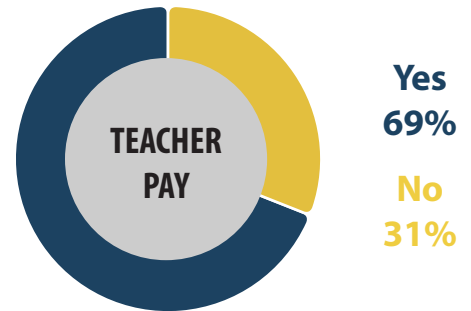
**6.** Which of the following do you think is more important?

- D. None of these need a funding increase



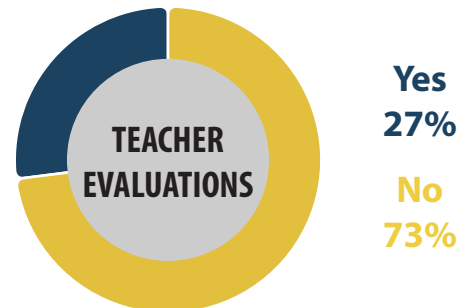
**7.** The U.S. is facing a shortage of teachers in subjects like math, science and special education. Do you think Indiana should direct more school funding specifically to teacher pay?

**10.** Do you support or oppose giving parents of children with special needs the option to use state educational funding for services such as school choice, tutoring or online courses?



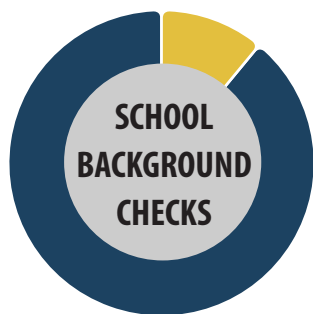

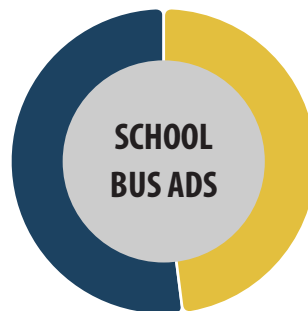
- 13.** Do you support or oppose allowing the sale of alcohol in licensed retail stores on Sundays, which is currently prohibited in Indiana?
